Dear Mrs. Ford:

First, I want to identify myself. I am Phil Buchen's secretary. He and Bunny have spoken so much of you that I really feel I know you myself. I have wanted many times to write a note to let you know how we appreciate your warm personality and your generosity to the staff (and also that of your husband), but felt I didn't want to impose on your time. My husband and I were privileged to be included in the reception you and the President gave on August 23, 1974, and wanted you to know how much we enjoyed the evening.

You have been in our prayers, and we are so pleased that you have recovered so beautifully. I can well understand how your back can flare up. I suffered for a year and a half with mine -- hardly able to walk -- and finally had surgery. I'm just fine now. I know how miserable you can be. We will continue to pray for the recovery of your back also.


