Physical Examination - Mr. Gerald R. Ford - 22 August 1974 President of the United States

Age: 61 - Birth date - July 14, 1913

The President had his first interval physical examination since becoming President this morning. His current medical history indicates that he continues to enjoy good health and has had very few problems.

Problem #1 - Pain in the left cervical area. This discomfort occurs sporadically and is often related to the position in which he sleeps and fatigue. The discomfort may radiate pain in the left shoulder. There have been no associated radicular symptoms.

Problem #2 - Post-Surgical Knees - His previous history of surgery has been very successful. He will, however, after prolonged activity have minimal discomfort in the right knee which may cause him to have a slight limp. He denies any frank signs of effusion or inflammation.

Problem #3 - Weight Control - The President has been on a 1800 calorie diet and has since lost 10 pounds, starting from 210, and he now weighs 200 3/4.

The patient denies any symptoms pertaining to the cardiovascular system and has an excellent exercise tolerance. He has continued intermittent Atromid-S for a slight lipid abnormality, although recently he has not taken any of this medication.

There have been no digestive complaints and bowel movements have been regular with stool of normal consistency and no evidence of bleeding on the tissue.

He has had no recent problems related to his history of sinus congestion although at times he may sneeze and have a post-nasal drip.

Eyes - The President requires glasses for close reading and has no other visual symptoms.

Ears - Nose and throat are normal.

Pulmonary - No difficulty with shortness of breath or cough.

Cardiovascular - Patient denies any exertional dyspnea, chest pain, palpitation or vascular difficulty.

Gastrointestinal - No difficulty with indigestion, abdominal discomfort, or unusual bowel movements.

Genitourinary - Nocturia one time per night with no urgency and no stress. Urine color is normal.

Neuromuscular - He has occasional pain in the left cervical area radiating to the left shoulder and he occasionally experiences slight discomfort in postsurgery right knee.

Neurological - He denies any headaches or problems related to the nervous system.

Skin - No skin lesions.

Physical Examination: Patient appears well nourished and robust. Blood pressure 120/80, pulse rate 58, temperature 98 degrees, height 72 inches, weight 200 3/4 pounds.

Eyes - Pupils are round, regular and react to light and accommodation. Extraocular movements normal. Ocular fundi normal.

Ears - Normal external ear canals. Ear drums are normal.

Nose - Slight deviation of the nasal septum. The mucosa appears normal.

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Mouth - Teeth are in good repair although there is dark tobacco staining. There is no mucosal abnormality involving his palate.

Neck - Neck is supple with good range of motion. Thyroid not enlarged. No lymph nodes. Carotid artery pulsations equal without bruit.

Breasts - Negative.

Lungs - Clear and resonant to percussion and auscultation.

Heart - No abnormal heart sounds. No murmurs or gallop sounds were heard. A2 normally split.

Abdomen - Soft and non-tender. No masses. Liver and spleen are not enlarged. Liver was 12 cm in the mid-clavicular line. Right appendix scar was intact. Inguinal rings were normal.

Rectal - Very small hemorrhoidal tags. Sphincter tone good. Prostate normal size, smooth, and non-tender. No feces were in the rectal ampulla.

External Genitalia - Normal male with normal sized testicles.

Neuromuscular Exam - Shoulder joints were completely normal with a good range of motion. The left knee was stable without inflammation and no swelling. The right knee appears somewhat larger than the left. There was some grating sensation on flexion. No tenderness was apparent. The range of motion was good. In both stances the quadriceps muscle strength was substantial. Examination of the feet revealed no abnormalities.

Neurological - All deep tendon reflexes are active and equal. No sensory abnormality noted.

The summary of the President's laboratory tests has indicated essentially normal blood counts and serum chemistries with the exception of a high normal uric acid of 8.8.

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The high normal range is (2.5-8.0). The serum cholesterol was 260 with the normal range (150-300). The level of his serum tryglycerides was 165 and the abnormal is greater than 200. Total and pre-B tryglycerides are within normal limits. Electrophoretic pattern not accurate when Rx has been instituted (non-baseline). Values are within normal limits for age. The urine was normal. The electrocardiogram remains unchanged from his previous tracing and is considered entirely normal. Blood type is O Rh positive.

In summary, the President is in excellent health and the only recommendations will be to provide a diet of 1800 calories with the goal of reducing one or two pounds a week until he reaches 195 pounds. In addition, he will be instructed in an exercise physical conditioning program which will include graduated knee weights, bicycling, and simple calisthenics which will be performed in his study each morning. In addition, he will be encouraged to play golf and swim if his schedule will allow it.

It is anticipated that the President will have his complete annual physical in January at Bethesda Naval Hospital.

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
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
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
