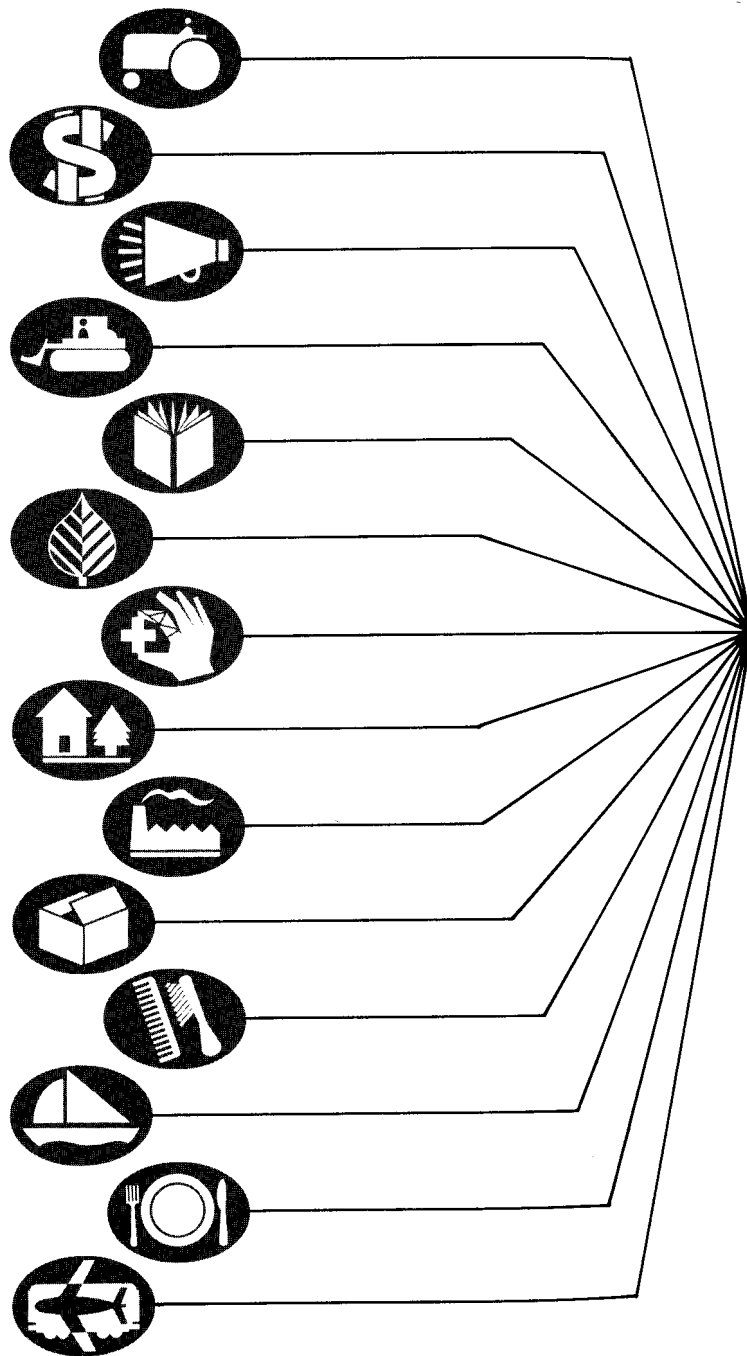

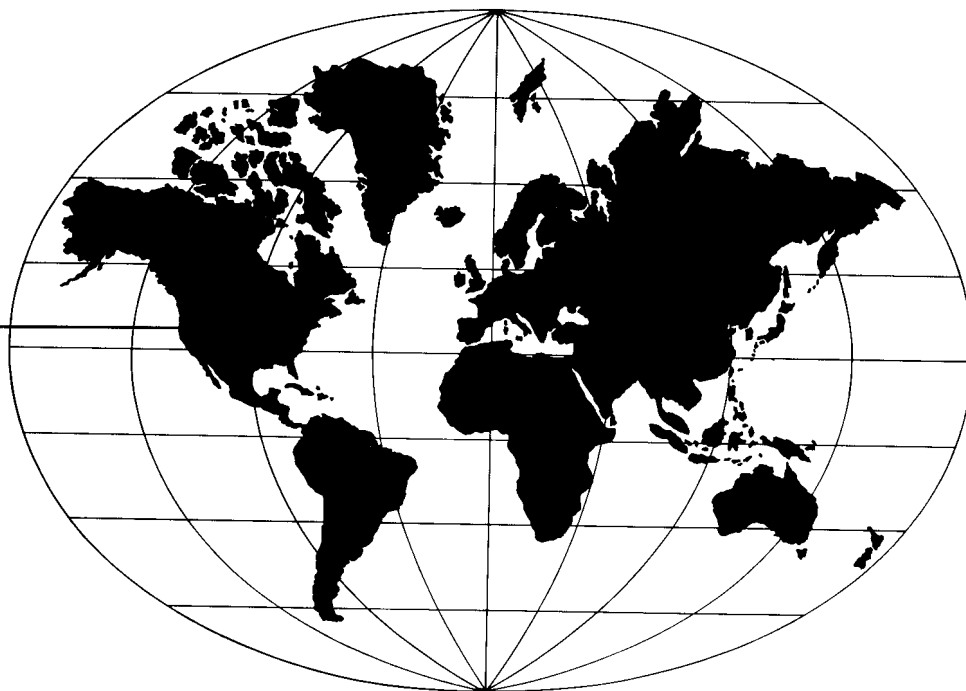

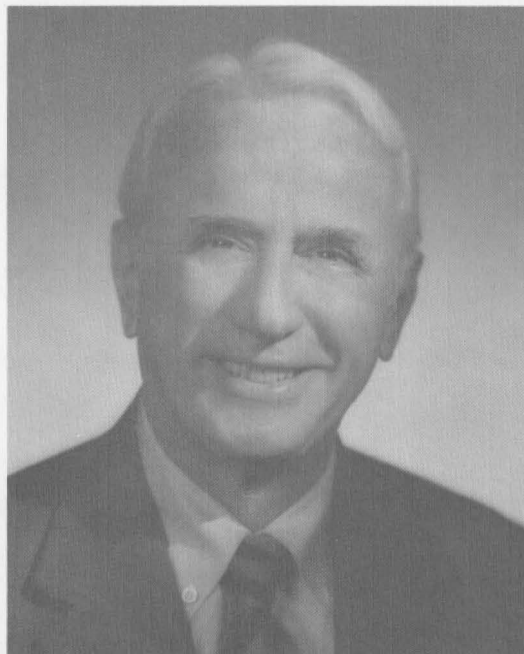

It is with pride that we honor these men tonight for their past service, their energetic enthusiasm, and their dedication which has set an example for our leaders in the years to come.



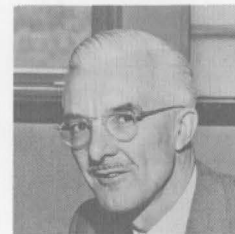

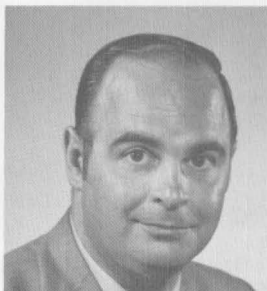

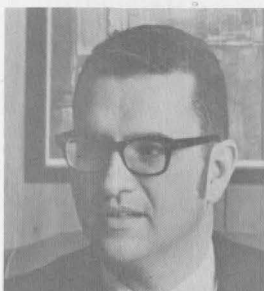

HISTORY OF SVIA

Twenty five years ago in an effort to help solve their mutual problems a group of nineteen industrial concerns from Skokie, Morton Grove and Lincolnwood decided to form the association we know today as SVIA. This group has grown rapidly until today the Skokie Valley Industrial Association numbers some 235 industrial firms on its rolls serving more than twenty nine major residential and industrial communities with a population in excess of 900,000 people.

As the organization grew, it expanded both its horizons and its membership. In 1956, SVIA employed its first full-time staff, relinquishing both the quarters and the part-time service of the Skokie Chamber of Commerce. It moved to its present quarters, 4927 Oakton Street, in Skokie at that time.

As it grew it extended its geographical confines so that now SVIA industries occupy an area that geographically extends throughout a three county area consisting of four congressional districts. The Association now extends well beyond the limits of the original Skokie Valley Region.

Our member companies, collectively, have more than 100,000 employees. These companies represent a broad

cross-section, as employment ranges from two in the smallest firm to some 7,000 employees in the largest member company.

SVIA was established to solve a problem—transportation for employees from Chicago to the suburban area. Next came freight and truck rates and then many more problems, not only for industries but for their communities. Through the years SVIA was ready and willing to cooperatively work together with its member companies and their communities. With the spirit of "What can I do to help," many problems have been solved which have made these communities better places to live and work.

Our professional Executive Director and staff work closely with the officers and board members of the Association. This administrative framework has enabled the Association to respond to the members' interests. By so doing we have created, over the years, a number of active working committees. Among these are General Membership, Finance, Industrial Safety, Personnel, Production, Purchasing, and Transportation and Distribution.

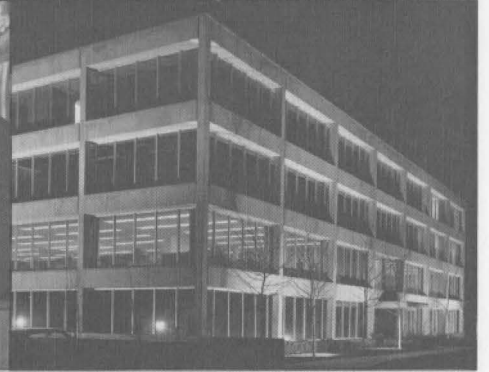
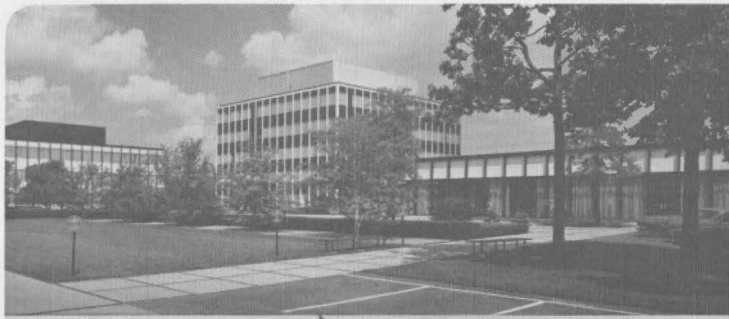
Management Development on all levels has also been our concern

through the years. SVIA has offered programs, courses, workshops, and seminars cooperatively that would not have been possible for many of our member companies—thus creating better supervisors, foremen, and managers—and in turn, improving member company's standards.

Perhaps another one of our major contributions is our Wage, Salary, and Personnel Practices Survey. Participated in by and shared by our member companies, this survey helps improve working conditions.

Our original purpose—promoting the welfare of the area it serves, providing facilities for the interchange of information and assistance, and fostering social relationships and fellowship among its members has led it, in the short span of a quarter of a century to become an important force for good in the life of the Skokie Valley area and its communities.

As we look to the next twenty five years, we hope to achieve the same degree of success and progress that these past presidents and their associates have had in the last twenty five years.



CHARTER MEMBERS

Twenty-five years ago, a group of businessmen representing 19 companies in Skokie Valley met to discuss some mutual problems. They found that working together they could solve many of their problems.

As a result, Skokie Valley Industrial Association was created with one of its objectives to promote the general welfare of the area in which its members are located in connection with economic, civic and educational problems. Chairman Terra, ladies and gentlemen, it is an honor and a pleasure to appear at the Twenty-Fifth Anniversary Dinner of the Skokie Valley Industrial Association. I congratulate the officers and members of this fine association. I am confident that the next quarter-century will be filled with even greater accomplishments for your organization and for the firms and communities that it represents.

When I became the Nation's first "instant" Vice President, I pledged to use whatever reputation for truth and fairness I acquired in the House along with whatever capacity for reasonable compromise I might possess to make this Government work better for the good of all Americans.

I believe the Vice Presidency presents a unique opportunity, since its perspective is both legislative and executive, that makes possible communication and compromise. I envisage a Vice Presidential function involving solid and responsible work for the future, mediating and moderating differences while remaining open and flexible to keep America great.

In this role, I would like to talk to you about what I see as the most immediate problem facing all of us. It is the problem of inflation.

Some would have us resign ourselves to inflation at current rates. They suggest we get accustomed to the inevitable. I do not agree.

The inflation in today's world must be viewed with continuous alarm.

- 1) It hurts 20 million American pensioners.
- 2) It hurts the poor who spend the largest share of their income on food.
- 3) It hurts the corporation whose depreciation allowance will not buy new costlier equipment.
- 4) It hurts the stock market, a supposed safe harbor from its ravages.
- 5) It hurts because it promotes hoarding and encourages spending, not saving.
- 6) It hurts because it destroys confidence in government.
- 7) It hurts because it creates a psychology of "every man for himself" — a mad scramble for higher wages and prices.

What shall we do about the present inflation?

No one claims to have the complete answer. But as a citizen, facing this problem every day as all of you are, I know we need solutions. I'm confident we will find them if we identify the problem as our number one concern.

With the official end of the control authority, a great challenge confronts the business community and the leaders of labor. If the fires of inflation are permitted to burn too fiercely, the demand for controls will inevitably arise throughout the Nation and will certainly be reflected in the Congress. That is not the best course.

I have confidence in the basic health and viability of our economy. I have faith in American industry and the common sense of the American worker. The real answer to inflation is not more controls but more production. This will come through the free enterprise policies that made our Nation great.

The ability of the free enterprise system to increase production and restrain prices has been proven in the past. Our free economy system can do it again.

The U. S. economy is designed to achieve greater productivity because of its basic emphasis on competition. But greater productivity will not occur automatically. We must make sure that government policies are consistent with our goals.

Economic leaders in the private sector -- both labor and management -- must avoid decisions that maximize short-term gains at the expense of lost jobs and markets. In this period of shortages, it may be possible to jump prices to take advantage of this situation. But shortages will be eliminated by increased production and a wiser policy would be to solidify markets through restrained pricing policies. Employees may feel that this is the time to increase their income demands. But the result could be a long-term loss of job opportunities. With prices rising rapidly, cost-cutting efforts may be ignored. Scarcities may increase pressures to restrain exports. But such decisions may lose American industries future markets and jobs.

Our economic leadership in the world depends upon increased productivity. In turn, our political and military role in the 1970's and beyond depends upon continued economic strength and stability. Now is the time to set policies that will insure solid economic growth and meet the challenge of future domestic and international competition.

Government, too, must do its part. Efforts to reduce, delay and cut back expenditures at the federal level must be continued.

The passage of the Congressional Budget Act will give Congress a powerful tool in controlling excess expenditures.

Alternative and innovative financing methods must be developed to prevent high interest rates which result in reduced housing production.

The tax and regulatory systems must be used to increase production in industries where shortages exist.

The Trade Reform Act must be passed so the President may negotiate elimination of barriers to trade which cost us several billion dollars a year in the form of higher consumer prices.

Inflation, unchallenged, is a major threat to our free economy and our form of government. It must be controlled. I am personally dedicated to this goal. It can be achieved. I call upon each and every one of you to join me in this great battle.
