Meeting with the Deans of Michigan State University Schools of Education

At 11:00 a.m. on Monday, June 16, in the Vice President's Conference Room the Deans of the nine of Michigan State University Schools of Education will be here to meet with you and Jim Cannon to discuss issues dealing with the Federal role in education. They understand that your schedule will only permit you to spend a brief amount of time with them but expect to discuss the following with Jim.

# 1. The Theme of "Work and Education"

President Ford in an August 1974 speech at Ohio State University called for an effort to establish a closer relationship between education in the schools and the world of work. A number of proposals have been developed by the Secretaries of Labor, HEW and Commerce but none have yet been approved by the President.

## 2. Vocational Education

The Administration has proposed legislation which would consolidate several existing categorical programs. The bill moves away from direct service support and moves toward encouraging innovative new projects. It authorizes \$523 million which is essentially the current level of support but its chances of passage this year are not good.

# 3. Federal Education Research and Development Policy

The principle operating research agency in the education field is the National Institute of Education in HEW. NIE provides a broad range of support for

research and developmental activities in such areas as: basic skills, educational finance, productivity and management, education and work, equality of educational opportunity and the dissemination of research results to the educational community.

In the FY 1976 President's Budget, the Administration is requesting \$80 million for NIE. This represents an increase of \$10 million above the amount provided in FY 1975.

In FY 1976, an estimated \$454 million will be spent by the Federal Government for educational research and development. Of this amount, some \$243 million will be spent on programs of research, development and demonstration throughout the Office of Education. In addition, the National Foundation on the Arts and the Humanities will expend \$36 million in FY 1976 in this area. It is estimated that outlays for NIE will total some \$84 million. The National Science Foundation will spend an estimated \$41 million in FY 1976.
