Almost ten years ago I visited with a Mr. Louis O. Kelso in San Francisco relative to a new economic plan they had developed called the second income plan.

I was quite impressed with it at the time and urged them to try and go ahead with it which they did, and I believe they have been rather successful in pushing this concept. I'm quite sure that the President has been exposed to this and I am also relatively certain that he has approved the idea.

I think Mr. Kelso and his associates have something that should at least be heard at the Economic Summit Conference, so I'm suggesting that you either lay this letter on the President's desk or advise him of my interest in having Mr. Kelso's plans displayed before the Summit Conference. Anything you can do on this would be appreciated.
