SUBJECT:

As you requested this morning, this provides the budget facts on the GI bill. The House-passed bill provides for a 22.7% increase in GI Bill benefits, with the exception of 18.2% increases for onthe-job and vocational rehabilitation training.

The table below indicates the relationships among the 1975 Budget, the suggestion you made to the Committee members during your trip to Chicago, the House bill, and the compromises suggested by Senator Hartke. All of the dollar estimates in the table are based upon a September 1 effective date of entitlement, which is the date in the House Bill.
