SUBJECT: President's Science Adviser

Rep. Tiger Teague (D-Tex), Chairman of the House Science and Space Committee, called today to alert you that his committee may move next year toward creating a Science Council in the Executive Office of the President similar to the Council of Economic Advisers. Tiger says he's receiving a lot of pressure from engineers, scientists, etc. to re-establish a Science Adviser in the White House.

You may recall that in the reorganization several years ago, the President abolished the Office of Science Adviser by naming the head of the National Science Foundation (Guy Stever) to this responsibility.

While this memo is for your information, you may wish to create your own Science Adviser. Perhaps your personnel office could prepare a study on the pros and cons.
