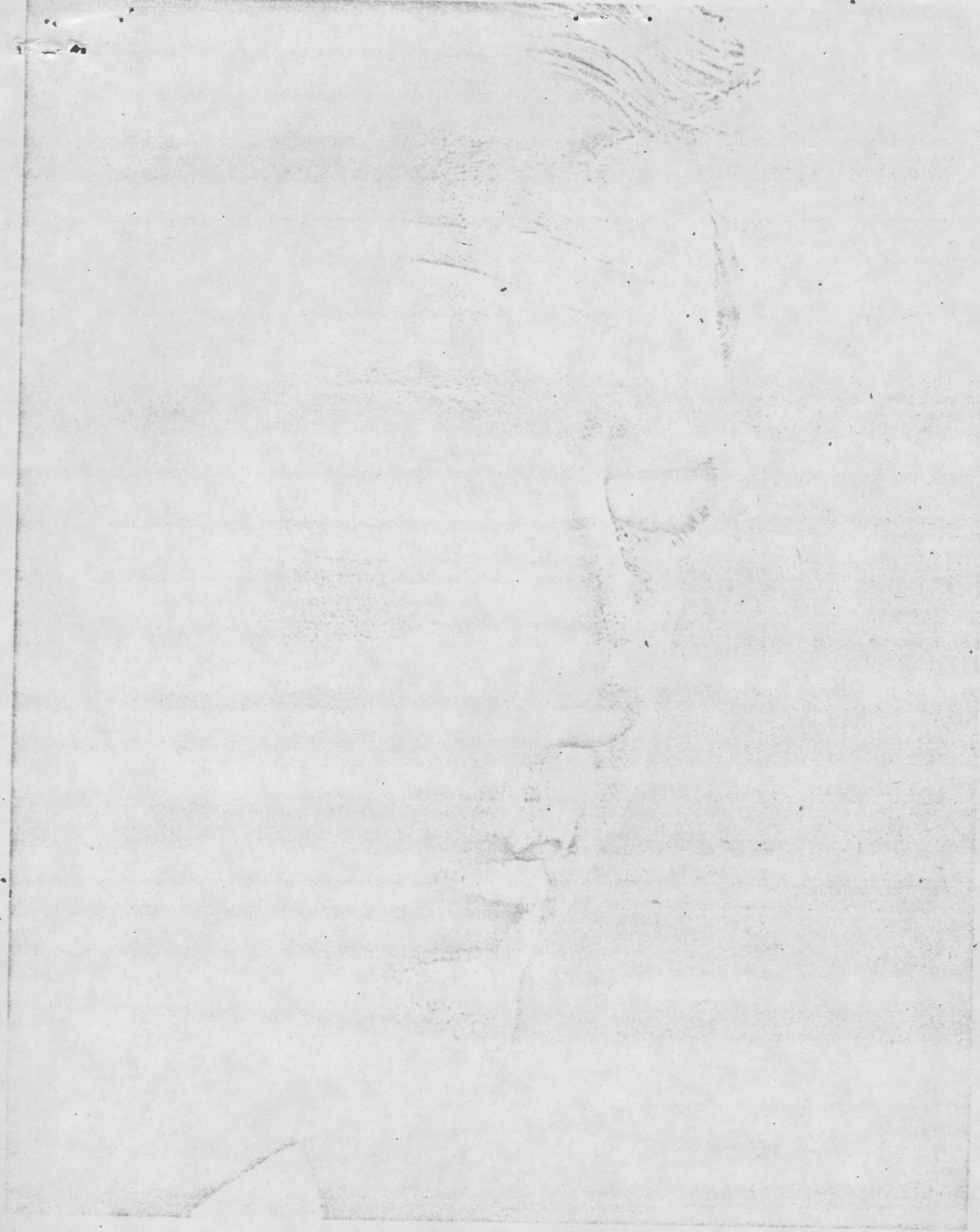
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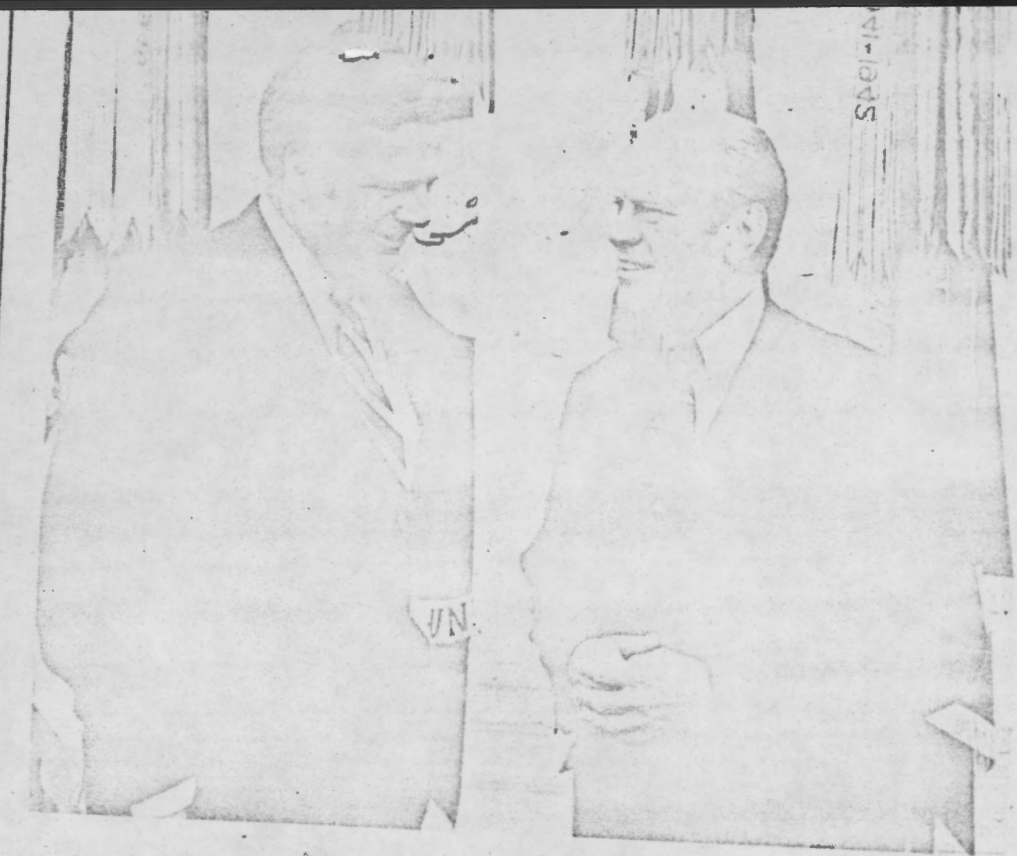

Goebel's New Message For Washington... Is Your Message

During the past two months I have been meeting with thousands of friends and neighbors in the Fifth District, and I've been listening to people speaking up on the things that are getting down. These are the issues which constitute the message - your message - which I want to take to Congress.

I also found that there are many people who are asking, "Who is Paul Goebel?" "What has he done?" "Does he stand on the issues?" We've chosen this newspaper supplement as a means of answering these questions. More information will reach you as the progress continues.

I am presently serving as a County Commissioner. Through my many community activities, I have come to know the problems facing this District and I am ready to carry your message to Congress.

I am sick of inflation as you are. I don't want to see you needlessly bused to faraway schools any more. I am as tired as you are of talk, but no more campaign and legislative reform. Like you, I want consumer protection, a clean environment, and local control of local problems. As you do that there should be open communication with Washington. That's why I have proposed monthly "Town Hall" meetings at which you can speak your mind about your government and be sure your message would arrive on Capitol Hill.

Democrats have controlled Congress for 38 of the years and what do we have to show for it? Higher taxes, energy problems, polluted lakes and countless unresolved issues which are languishing in Congressional tie-ups for years.

I am concerned about the low level of confidence in our government. We can restore this faith by electing representatives who are honest, who possess the courage of their convictions and who truly listen to the people who have to say.

Let the people of Michigan's 5th Congressional District want and deserve legislative democracy, free of legislative dictatorship of a veto-proof Congress sought by some members of the Party.

So, let's send a new message to Congress. Isn't it time your voice was heard?

Here is how I stand on some of the issues that confront us now.

INFLATION. I think it is time to stop throwing around vague, complicated economic theories and get to the guts of the problem. I strongly favor holding the line on government spending and balancing the budget. I do not favor wage and price controls or increased taxation. And, I don't believe that inflation can be solved at the government level alone—all sectors of the economy have a responsibility to cooperate in finding a solution. We simply cannot continue fighting inflation with more inflation as my opponent has done by introducing in Congress a bill which would create 900,000 new government jobs at a cost to the taxpayer of \$2.9 billion. We must stop spending what we don't have! This bill will only add to the overwhelming cost of government, increase the tax burden and contribute nothing to the solution of the inflation problem. My opponent also voted against an amendment which proposed a \$9 billion reduction in the Mass Transit authorization. This was an excellent opportunity to back President Ford's anti-inflation efforts, yet my opponent, who talks against inflation, chose not to do so.

UNEMPLOYMENT. Unemployment is one of the most serious problems facing our country. I believe that primary efforts to reduce unemployment should be made in the private sector and not by the government. I favor legislation which would give tax credits to industries specifically earmarked for expansion, combined with tax adjustments for individuals in order to provide more purchasing power. I further believe that interest rates should be reduced and the Small Business Administration loan program expanded, especially in high unemployment areas. I would also approve of short term expansion of the unemployment insurance program if the situation becomes critical.

ABORTION. I support current legislation which would initiate a Constitutional amendment to limit abortion to cases of rape, incest, certain deformity of the child as the result of illness or drugs and situations in which the life or physical health of the mother is jeopardized. My opponent voted to provide federal funds for abortions, and he supports the status quo - i.e. abortions on demand.

BUSING. I am strongly opposed to busing as a solution to the problems of poorer educational opportunities for minority children. I believe that the great social harm and physical dangers of busing far outweigh any possible educational benefits. Providing an equal education for all children without resorting to busing should not be a difficult goal to achieve. My opponent voted against an anti-busing amendment to

the elementary and secondary education bill last spring.

CAMPAIGN REFORM. I have always been a strong advocate of fair and meaningful campaign reform. I am in favor of qualified government subsidization with limitations on contributions and expenditures, combined with full public disclosure.

COMMUNICATIONS. I believe it is essential that people know what is going on in government and have an opportunity to express themselves. To accomplish this end I propose establishing regularly scheduled monthly "Town Hall" meetings in the district to augment regular visits, field offices, newsletters and other usual communications methods.

CONSUMER PROTECTION. I believe the abuses of consumer trust by certain businesses and industries have justified the enactment of recent consumer protection legislation. However, I am concerned that we might be going too far in certain areas such as the mandatory use of automobile seat belts.

ENVIRONMENT. I support enactment of the Land Use Bill now pending in Congress, which encourages state and local governments to zone wisely. I favor sound legislative programs and planning at all government levels to protect the total environment.

LEGISLATIVE REFORM. I feel that part of Congress' declining popularity is a result of its many anachronistic practices. For example, greater use should be made of modern computer technology to achieve a smoother running Congress. The incumbent voted to stifle consideration of Congressional reform when the need for freeing the House from its anachronistic committee structure has never been greater.

AMNESTY. I approve of President Ford's recent statement on qualified amnesty. I agree that persons involved should be required to serve their country before total amnesty is granted.

PAROCHIAL AID. I support a program of tax credits for parents who have children in private elementary and secondary schools. I also support the present program of combined use of facilities, special education and funds to institutions granting degrees.

SOCIAL WELFARE. I support programs which help to promote the general welfare of all the people as long as they are productive members of society. I feel many social welfare programs are poorly planned and administered and that considerable waste of tax dollars results. There should be better coordination of programs and services at all levels of government. I am strongly opposed to a welfare system in which it is more profitable not to work, or any system in which controls are so loosely applied that parasites can

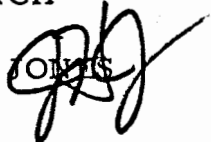
