Matthew Rinaldo	Recommends that Patrick J. Ferrante be appointed as Deputy Administrator of the Nat'l Fire Prevention and Control Administration.
Edw Eshleman	Asks that the President give consideration to the request of the Wilbur Chocolate Company that he establish a global quota for refined and raw sugars of approximately 14 million tons.
Trent Lott	Requests that the President re-submit the nomination of Bert A. Gallegos as the Director of the Office of Economic Opportunity.
Robert Lagomarsino	Asks that consideration be given to Mrs. Barbara Bonadeo's inquiry regarding the number of employees assigned to San Clemente.
Vernon Thomson	Transmits the suggestions of Robert W. Gotzman regarding ways to combat inflation.
Wm Cotter	Urges the President to sign the Vietnam-era Veterans' Readjustment Act.
Orval Hansen	Supports the invitation to the President to address the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education on March 1, 1975.
George Danielson	Asks that the President send a message on the occasion of the testimonial dinner for Chet Holifield on December 8.
Henry Reuss	Recommends that Mark B. Sandground be appointed to the Board of the East-West Center for Cultural Interchange.
L. H. Fountain	Recommends that Frank Frazier be appointed to the Commodity Futures Trading Commission.

Frank Clark

Is concerned about reports that the President favors lifting the controlled price of oil produced in the U. S. ; feels that it is time that more attention is given to the American oil consumer and less to the wishes of the oil industry.

Jerry Litton

Thanks President for meeting with him and Senator Weicker regarding taxpayer confidentiality; says his staff stands ready to be of any assistance possible. (Letter was missent and reached the White House today.)

Edward Koch

Requests that the President send 1000 Federal law enforcement officials including Federal Executive Protection Service Officers and Federal Marshals to take the place of N. Y. City policemen at the UN to provide protection for the PLO delegation during its visit there.

Stuart Symington	Recommends that Robert B. Vining be appointed as Chairman of the NLRB.
Charles McC. Mathias	Thanks President for letter and pen in commemoration of the signing of the Federal Campaign Act Amendments.
Mrs. John Cooper	Thanks President for the inscribed pictures.
The Nebraska Congressional Delegation	Recommend that Norbert T. Tiemann be appointed as Secretary of Transportation in the event there is a vacancy.
J. Bennett Johnston	Writes in support of James A. Gallagher's interest in attending a meeting in Washington concerning the needs of the mortgage banking and housing industries.
Charles McC. Mathias	Asks that a Presidential message be sent to Larry McClain on the occasion of the National Vehicle Dealers Congress on Dec 1.
Herman Talmadge	Recommends that John D. Biggerstaff be appointed to the Nat'l Advisory Committee on Juvenile Delinquency.
Roman Hruska	Recommends that F. Vinson Roach be appointed to the commission to study the federal regulatory agencies.
