The Governor said that he met earlier this week with the Republican members of the National Governors' Conference which includes Bob Ray of Iowa, Dan Evans of Washington and Tom McCall of Oregon. They all want you to attend the Annual Meeting of the Republican Governors at the meeting to be held in St. Louis on December 3rd.

I indicated that with the Lame Duck Congress being here that there were a number of scheduling problems in early December, but that I would inform you of his request.



Attached is a memo to the President from Jim Cavanaugh describing a telephone conversation Cavanaugh had with Governor Christopher Bond of Missouri. The President indicated that he would like to attend the National Governor's Conference if possible and wanted to know if there were any scheduling problems. Cheney told me that there are indeed scheduling problems, but asked that you pull together a scheduling option paper which could be sent to the Presidential party in the Far East. Your memo should show the events that would have to be cancelled if the President were to choose to go to the Conference. You may want to talk to Cavanaugh about the event before you make your recommendations.
