The Residence

Sen. Griffin now feels your breakfast should be Republicans only. He points out the Democrats could well start haggling over Michigan's economy and turn the event into a gripe session. He also says this is an extension of the regular Michigan GOP breakfasts that have been going on for some time.

Rep. Cederberg, however, felt the breakfast should be bipartisan to avoid partisanship.

Bob and Al said the decision is yours and they are happy either way.

My own recommendation is to have the Republicans only, low-key, as a continuation of Republican delegation meetings you've attended before.
