General Revenue Sharing

In his recent interview on the Today Show, Governor Shapp expressed the opinion that Pennsylvania has suffered because Federal categorical grants were cut after the enactment of General Revenue Sharing.

The record does not support the Governor, as the attached table shows. Total Federal grants to Pennsylvania rose from \$1,621 million in 1972 to \$2,358 million in 1973, and an estimated \$2,470 million in 1974. These figures represent annual increases of 17% for 1971-72, 45% for 1972-73, and 4.7% for 1973-74. The Governor may be unhappy about the 4.7% increase in 1973-74, but continued increases in the range of the 1971-73 increases would be unreasonable. The percentage increase for Pennsylvania in 1973-74 is still higher than the percentage increase for total Federal aid to all States.

If we subtract Pennsylvania's 1973 and 1974 General Revenue Sharing payments of \$347 million and \$318 million from the State's total Federal aid, it received \$2,011 million and \$2,152 million in those two years. Under this assumption, annual increases for Federal aid to Pennsylvania were 17% for 1971-72, 24% for 1972-73, and 7.1% for 1973-74.

These figures, however, are somewhat distorted by unusually high payments in 1973 and 1974 for Federal disaster relief as a result of hurricane Agnes. Thus, the relevant base is Federal aid to Pennsylvania net of both General Revenue Sharing and Federal disaster relief. Subtracting out both General Revenue Sharing and Federal disaster relief gives Pennsylvania \$1,621 million in 1972, \$1,813 million in 1973, and an estimated \$2,045 million in 1974. If these figures represent the programs Governor Shapp was complaining about, they increased 17% in 1971-72, 12% in 1972-73, and an estimated 13% in 1973-74, and do not support his position.
