BACKGROUND:

- Michel is the newly elected House Republican Whip. He has worked extremely hard to round up votes to sustain the veto. This call would be a great shot in the arm.
- From a base of 114 votes, we now have commitments of more than the 145 needed to sustain. This has led the Democrats to refer the vetoed bill back to Ways and Means.
- This represents a major victory for the President 3. and for Michel's fledgling whip organization.
