Amidst the travail on the Hill, we have had some modest successes.


In Foreign Relations we have extricated John Lehman by 9-6 and expect it on the Floor soon after the recess.

In Judiciary, thanks to Roman, we've propelled Tom Meskill to the Floor 8-6, and we think he will make it.

In Rules, we have reported the six Federal Elections Commissioners by 7-1 and should be all right on the Floor.

In the Wyman-Durkin fight we've won most of the procedural battles so that the count should be generally fair, and our chances depend as much on the luck of the count as on the composition of the Committee.
