Status of the 40,000 Employment Cut

The 40,000 employment cut you announced last August aimed at a level of 1,928,100 full-time positions in the Executive Branch (excluding the Postal Service) on June 30, 1975.

As of March 31, full-time employment was 1,914,440, about 13,700 under your original goal for the year.

However, there is a possibility that employment will exceed your original goal. The February budget established ceilings totaling 1,930,700 for all the agencies. Since that time, under heavy pressure from a number of agencies, we have approved further ceiling increases of 4,700, including 4,000 for the Social Security Administration. Attainment of the 40,000 reduction depends upon whether hiring by the agencies in April, May and June causes employment levels to come close to their present ceilings.
