This is a bill that has been worked on for 4 or 5 years. We have gone this in three different Congresses and by different people on both sides of the aisle, and we passed the bill and we want the bill to be passed again, and if we do then you will do the President a favor, you will do the country a favor, and you will do our land a favor-so I urge the Members to vote to override the veto.

The SPEAKER. Without objection, the previous question is ordered.

There was no objection.

The SPEAKER. The question is, Will the House, on reconsideration, pass the bill, the objections of the President to the contrary notwithstanding?

Under the Constitution, this vote must be determined by the yeas and nays.
