Observations, White House
Fellowship Year

Each year, a small number of men and women are brought to Washington as White House Fellows. They are assigned as Special or Executive Assistants at the Secretarial/White House Senior Staff level of government. They also meet with eminent government and private sector officials (domestic and foreign) at education sessions during the fellowship year. There is the opportunity to gain interdepartmental and top governmental perspective.

In the belief that the year should not end without at least a partial statement of observations, this paper was prepared. It is of singular origin, relying, as indicated, on input from some of the Fellows. It does not represent unanimity of view; it should not be considered the position of the White House Fellows.

An organizational note: One thought pattern is presented per page. Each page is tabbed and a table of contents is at Tab A. As with other papers of this type, little heed is given to the "much good" accomplished by the Administration over the last year. That good has been of benefit to the nation and a credit to the Administration. This paper will look to areas that presumably need attention so as to continue the job of better serving the people.
