MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRESIDENT

SUBJECT: Chairman Olin E. "Tiger" Teague (D-TEX)

Tiger Teague requested the President receive two messages:

1. Regarding the President's recent call on ERDA, Mr. Teague said he was dismayed to learn today that Chuck Mosher is planning to be gone the next several weeks. Teague urged that the President intervene to keep Mosher in town.
2. Teague expects opposition in the Democratic primary. He desires Presidential permission to use some favorable material about himself that is known to the President and reflects Presidential approval of Teague.
