As you know an informal working dinner for the members of the Cabinet has been scheduled for Thursday evening, November 6th. In view of the changes that have occurred, I would like to get some guidance on how we should proceed with the dinner.

As it currently stands neither the Vice President, Secretary Schlesinger nor Secretary Morton plan to attend the dinner because of previous commitments. Therefore, if we go ahead as scheduled the group will essentially include the members of the President's new Cabinet with the exception of Elliot Richardson.

Go ahead with dinner on the 6th as planned:
