
Dear Phyllis,

As you probably know, the Senate has passed the Common Situs Picketing bill which will now go to Conference Committee to work out the differences between it and the measure passed by the House. Upon completion of this process, the final bill will come to the White House.

Also, I know and understand that many people share your views about Right to Work.
