

### Close-Out

The last refugees in the Task Force system are scheduled to leave Fort Chaffee for their new homes on Saturday, December 20. With the closing of Fort Chaffee, we will be terminating our operations and will turn over residual responsibility for domestic aspects of resettlement to a Refugee Task Force in the Office of the Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare on January 1. International aspects of resettlement became the responsibility of the Coordinator for Humanitarian Affairs in the State Department on October 31.

### Oversight Hearing

On December 18 I testified before the House Subcommittee on Immigration, Citizenship and International Law chaired by Congressman Eilberg of Pennsylvania. The Subcommittee gave high praise to the Task Force, the Administration, and all involved with the resettlement program for completing the program "on schedule" and "in the black."

### Awards

I am earnestly hoping for a decision on Presidential recognition of the key civilian, military and voluntary people who contributed significantly to the resettlement program and your Task Force. I understand that my memoranda to you of November 10 and 11 on this subject are now being reviewed at the White House staff level.

### Final Report

This is the final report in the series of weekly reports I have been sending you on the status of the Indochina Refugee Resettlement Program. It has been a privilege and an honor for me to have been the Director of your Task Force for this noble undertaking and I am grateful for your confidence and support.
