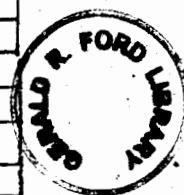

**SUBJECT:** Reduction-In-Force at Kelly AFB, Texas

**QUESTION:** Why is it necessary for the Air Force to reduce its work force at Kelly AFB, Texas?

**ANSWER:** Based on the overall FY 1976 Defense civilian manpower strength authorized by the Congress and the resulting allocations of those authorizations to the Military Departments, the Air Force must reduce their civilian work force from 278,000 to 265,000. This reduction of 13,000 has resulted in the involuntary separation of between 1,000 and 1,250 employees of the San Antonio Air Logistics Center, at Kelly AFB. These reductions will be carried out under strict compliance with Civil Service Commission rules and regulations. Career and career conditional personnel adversely affected will be afforded full advantage of the DoD Program for Stability of Civilian Employment. This action was announced in December 1975.

**BACKGROUND:** Union officials of the AFGE, today said in San Antonio, Texas, that they plan to file an injunction against the RIF in progress at Kelly AFB, Texas. The union leaders indicated that they would claim discrimination and failure on the part of the Air Force to file an Environmental Impact Statement on the RIF. More than 4,000 job change notices have been sent out at Kelly, and it is estimated that some 1,250 employees will lose their jobs in mid-May. Many of these (last-hired, lower-grade, semi-skilled) employees will be from minority groups.

In recent years, we have reduced our civilian force in consonance with Congressional wishes to keep Department of Defense (DOD) manning at an absolute minimum. Some of the management actions taken to reach this objective have involved base closures; support aircraft reductions; and headquarters reductions. During this same time period, Congress added reductions to those initiated by the Air Force and DOD. In order to lessen the adverse impact on employees during economically troubled times and following Congressional recommendations, these reductions were taken primarily by attrition through the use of selective hiring freezes. Serious skill imbalances, however, have resulted from these actions. Especially within the Air Force Logistics Command (AFLC) the skill imbalance problem has resulted in an excess of certain skilled workers, in effect preventing the hiring of other more needed skills because of dollar and manpower constraints limiting the overall size of the work force. It is imperative that the skill imbalance problem be corrected and that implementation of improved management programs such as the Depot Plant Modernization Program; System/Item Management reorganization, which includes the consolidation of AFLC Cataloging and Standardization functions; and workload consolidations under the Technology

Repair Center concept, not result in further imbalances. To achieve this objective in Fiscal Year (FY) 1976, it is necessary that we involuntarily separate AFLC employees whose skills do not match priority requirements.

Based on civilian manpower strengths in the DOD Appropriation Authorization Act for FY 1976 (Public Law 94-106) and the DOD allocation of those strengths, the most efficient operation of AFLC will require involuntary separation of an estimated 2,380 to 2,945 permanent employees. Following are the anticipated reductions by state and installation.

Projections provided are our best judgment of separations. Separations, however, could fluctuate upward or downward depending on the accuracy of attrition projections and resulting projections of ability to place personnel in jobs for which they qualify during the fiscal year period. Accordingly, a range of

potential separations is provided rather than a specific number for each installation. With respect to attrition, you will be interested to know that most attrition losses are associated with individual and personal decisions by employees and are not controllable by management.

With respect to employees affected adversely by these actions, career and career-conditional personnel will be afforded full advantage of the DOD Program for Stability of Civilian Employment.

## ARMY ANNOUNCES PLANS

## FOR INSTALLATION REALIGNMENT STUDIES

CLOSE NO.

Secretary of the Army Martin R. Hoffmann today announced proposed management actions to improve Army combat capability by reducing non-essential overhead and support personnel and <sup>(their associated)</sup> costs.

In announcing plans to initiate formal study of 18 base realignment actions, Secretary Hoffmann said, "The candidate actions, if finally approved and implemented, would result in a reduction of approximately 3600 Army civilian positions, an annual net savings to the Army of at least \$42 million and release to active combat units of about 1500 paid military personnel and spaces now associated with support assignments." As an illustration of the potential benefits of these candidate actions on overall Army capabilities, Secretary Hoffmann stated, "The reallocation of military personnel <sup>(savings)</sup> equates to two mechanized infantry battalions, and the dollar savings equates to the annual mission operating costs for two armored divisions."

Today's announcement initiates <sup>a</sup> the detailed study process to determine the advisability of implementing the candidate actions. As part of this study effort, the Army will thoroughly evaluate all aspects of the actions.

CLOSE NO.

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In those cases where it is determined that the candidate <sup>action</sup> ~~(is a)~~  
~~[major action which]~~ could significantly affect the quality of the human environment, the Army will prepare environmental impact statements as required by existing regulations. These statements will include consideration of such environmental factors as pollution, population and traffic conditions together with any related socio-economic impact of the realignments on employment, housing, public schools, recreational activities, etc. These statements will be filed with the Council on Environmental Quality and disseminated to all interested agencies and parties for comment. Notice of the availability of these statements will also be published in the Federal Register. It is anticipated that the study process for such actions will require a period of four to nine months to complete:

In those cases where it is determined that the candidate is not a major action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment, only environmental assessments will be prepared.

Following are the Army candidate actions included in today's announcement:

In order to reduce the number of unneeded, high cost, single mission installations, the Army will study <sup>possible</sup> the closure of Fort Hamilton and Fort Totten, New York; Fort MacArthur, California; Jefferson Proving



Ground, Indiana; Arlington Hall Station, Virginia; Vint Hill Farms Station, Virginia; and Fort Buchanan, Puerto Rico and the termination of most of the Army's activities at Fort Indiantown Gap, Pennsylvania. In addition, the Army will study closure of the family housing activities at Schilling Manor, Kansas.

As part of its continuing program to streamline depot storage and maintenance operations, <sup>the</sup> Army will study the closure of Savanna Army Depot, Illinois and the relocation of aircraft maintenance activities from New Cumberland Army Depot, Pennsylvania, to a consolidated facility at Corpus Christi, Texas. In addition, the Army will study relocation of the tool set assembly mission from Rock Island Arsenal, Illinois.

In an effort to reduce non-essential overhead support costs connected with its base structure, the Army will study the conversion of the base operations support function to contract operations for the Army's activities at Selfridge Air National Guard Base, Michigan and Stewart Airport, New York. The Army will also <sup>investigate the possibility of</sup> study consolidating activities currently at Fort Story, Virginia with activities at Fort Eustis, Virginia, reduction of base operations support requirements at Fort Detrick, Maryland, and attempt to effect real estate economies at Oakland Army Terminal, California, by concurrent use or lease by other Government agencies or by industry.

The Army will undertake studies to reduce the number of existing school activities by consolidation. <sup>Included in this effort will be studies of possible</sup> The Army will, therefore, also study the consolidation of the Ordnance School, Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland

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with the Missile and Munitions School at Redstone Arsenal, Huntsville, Alabama, <sup>and</sup> ~~The~~ consolidation of the Army Security Agency School at Fort Devens, Massachusetts, with Army school activities at other locations ~~and~~ ~~will be studied along with~~ possible relocation of troop units from ~~that~~ ~~installation~~ Ft. Devens.

Feasible and practical alternatives to the above candidate actions will also be considered as part of the study effort. Comments pertaining to any of the candidate actions may be provided for consideration to Headquarters, Department of the Army, ATTN: DACS-DMA, Washington, D. C. 20310. No administrative implementation of any of the above candidate actions will take place until at least 30 days after completion of the necessary studies.

In addition to the realignment studies, the Army will take immediate action to reduce the scope of operations at Picatinny Arsenal, New Jersey by the reduction of 280 civilian positions, and at Fort Ord, California by the reduction of 506 civilian positions.

Further, the Army will reduce the scope of operations in the US Army Recruiting Command (USAREC) by disestablishing seven District Recruiting Headquarters. This action will affect 76 military and 80 civilian positions.

The Modern Army Selected Test, Evaluation and Review (Project MASSTER) will also be redesignated as a test activity of the Army's Training and Doctrine Command (TRADOC) which will affect 103 military and 49 civilian positions.

For those candidate installation realignment actions finally approved for implementation, career employees who will be affected by such actions will be given maximum assistance in continuing their careers as employees of the Federal Government through transfer with function or reassignment to other positions in the Department of Defense or other Federal Agencies. In addition, in cooperation with the Department of Labor and State Employment Services, assistance will be given ~~(to)~~

~~(employees)~~ in locating positions in private industry. Where appropriate, <sup>affected employees</sup> ~~(they)~~ will be given the opportunity to undertake retraining programs to qualify them for jobs available in their local labor markets.

~~(Further)~~ The President's Economic Adjustment Committee will be available to bring the resources of the Federal Government to bear on alleviating the economic impact on communities <sup>affected by these actions.</sup> The Secretary of Defense chairs this interagency committee <sup>(comprised of representatives from)</sup> ~~which is made up of~~ 19 Federal departments and agencies. <sup>Economic Adjustment</sup> The ~~(Committee)~~ works with state and local governments and the private sector to create new private sector jobs to replace the Defense jobs that will be eliminated.

A state-by-state breakdown of the installations involved in the announcement is attached.

DEFENSE BASE REALIGNMENTS

The Department of Defense proposes to consolidate and realign approximately 150 military installations in the United States and overseas. Estimated savings are 14,000 U.S. civilians and 6,000 foreign national positions. In addition, 30,000 military positions associated with certain facilities would no longer be needed, but all of these positions will be redistributed to other locations with no overall reduction in military manpower levels.

Background

The President's tentative decisions on the 1977 Defense Budget included a reduction of 48,000 civilian positions, to be implemented by a variety of actions including base realignments and reductions in support and overhead personnel. On appeal, Defense proposed and the President approved a smaller reduction of 26,000 civilian positions, about half of which would be achieved through base realignments and the balance through headquarters reductions.

The current structure of Defense installations evolved over a long period. With few exceptions, most facilities were built originally to meet emergency requirements during a war. Military installations were frequently retained at the end of the war and given new missions -- at least in

part because of the importance they had assumed in the economy of the local region. The resulting base structure is oversized, fragmented, and poorly organized for efficient operations. Overcapacity increased as military strength declined 40% from 3.4 million military personnel at the peak of the Vietnam war to 2.1 million today.

#### National Environmental Policy Act

In the past, Defense has planned base realignments in the strictest confidence until they were announced as final decisions. The National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) now requires a more public review process. On the basis of recent court decisions concerning the rights of persons affected by base realignments, Defense has concluded that the only practical means of achieving the proposed realignments is to announce them as being "under study" and to invite public participation in the evaluation process.

#### Programmatic Rationale

The actions proposed by the Defense Department fall into seven major categories:

With three exceptions noted below, the proposed Defense re-alignments appear to be based on sound programmatic grounds. However, because of the sensitive nature of the proposals, we have had to rely on a single source of information in Defense and our own inherent knowledge of the Defense program. We have not discussed these questions with the military departments to verify the specific numbers and actions involved. However, the broad programmatic rationale provided by Defense appears to be a sound basis for the actions recommended.

- ° Consolidation of SAC Forces -- Over the past eighteen months, Defense has reduced the number of B-52 squadrons (although the number of aircraft

remains the same for SALT purposes) and transferred a number of tanker aircraft to the Reserve Forces. The Air Force would now like to realign the SAC basing structure to conform to these decisions by effectively closing two major bases (the property will be retained by Defense) and by making smaller reductions and changes at other bases.

- ° Centralization of training and intelligence activities -- Defense proposes to centralize and combine a number of similar training and intelligence activities. For example, the Air Force now operates seven pilot training installations. Over the past few years, the number of pilots trained has declined to a point where two of these seven bases are not needed to meet anticipated future requirements.
- ° Reduced scope of naval aviation facilities -- Defense plans to reduce the number of Navy carrier air wings from 14 to 13 this year. In addition, the specialized anti-submarine aircraft carriers have been completely eliminated from the force since 1968, and the number of anti-submarine warfare aircraft reduced significantly. Although we did close one Naval aircraft

- maintenance facility in 1973, it is now appropriate to make further reductions.

- Mission Changes for Air Guard and Reserve facilities -- The transfer of aircraft from active forces to reserve forces, principally the KC-135 jet tankers, requires some restructuring of reserve units to accommodate the new aircraft. About 35 relatively small changes are involved.
- Centralization of industrial facilities -- Defense proposes to combine a number of industrial facilities (such as the Army aviation maintenance facilities) for simple efficiency reasons. Other facilities are proposed for reduction or elimination, because it will be less costly to use commercial rather than Government facilities (such as housing operations and maintenance at Selfridge AFB).
- Other -- The remaining actions are proposed for a variety of programmatic and efficiency reasons.
- Overseas -- Defense also proposes a small number of actions overseas, including Puerto Rico, Guam, Morocco, Taiwan, the United Kingdom and Japan/Okinawa. Except for Japan/Okinawa, these proposals are relatively minor, involving Federal civilian job reductions numbering less than 500 each. Japan/Okinawa is a major action, reflecting



decisions made in the 1976 and 1977 budget reviews, and reductions of 5,600 Federal civilian and over 2,500 military jobs.

### Assessment

With the exceptions noted below, the list proposed by the Department of Defense appears reasonable and program-matically sound. Even in the case of the exceptions, a full review of the details with the military departments involved could provide additional information which would justify these proposals.

- ° Helicopter pilot training -- During the 1977 Budget review the Secretary of Defense approved consolidation of all initial training for helicopter pilots at a single installation for all military services. The central installation for this training was to be Fort Rucker, Alabama, which is currently used to train Army and Air Force helicopter pilots. Defense now proposes to move Naval air training activities to Pensacola, Florida from Corpus Christi, Texas, ostensibly to offset the movement of Navy helicopter training from Pensacola to Fort Rucker. | It is not clear from the Defense proposal that this move is cost effective unless done in conjunction with the helicopter

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training consolidation. Despite this move from Corpus Christi to Pensacola, Defense does not now propose to move the Navy helicopter pilot training to Fort Rucker. Defense could achieve substantial long-term savings by consolidating the Navy helicopter training at Fort Rucker. In any event, unless Defense can justify, on its own merits, the move of Naval air training activities out of Texas to Pensacola, this proposal should not be approved until the helicopter training is moved to Fort Rucker.

- ° Naval aircraft rework facilities -- The Defense proposal reduces over 500 civilians at Naval aircraft rework facilities. We believe that it would be more efficient, in the long run, to close a single facility, rather than make small reductions at all of them.
- ° Navy Resale Office -- The Defense proposal would move the Navy Resale Office (the headquarters for the Navy exchange system) from Brooklyn, New York to Great Lakes, Illinois with a second option of transfer to Philadelphia, Pa. The better alternative would be to relocate the Navy Resale Office to Philadelphia, since there are tentative plans

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to phase out Navy recruit training from Great Lakes and it is possible that the entire facility could be closed in the next few years. Moving the Navy Resale Office there, at this time, would make it more difficult and more costly to phase out Great Lakes in an orderly fashion.

Table A summarizes the net military and civilian personnel affected by State and the percentage impact on the local community. Tab B provides programmatic information, by State, for the most significant actions.

Under NEPA regulations, the Defense review has proceeded about as far as it can in all but one area. Defense has identified those installations and facilities which would lose military and civilian personnel under the proposed plan, but they have not yet selected all of the installations which would gain additional personnel. For example, within the Continental U. S., approximately 20,000 civilians would no longer be needed at certain present facilities; 7,000 will ultimately be reassigned to other bases to perform the same or a similar function and 13,000 will be laid off. Defense has not yet identified new assignments for about 2,000 civilians who will be retained. On the military side, over 30,000 personnel will no longer be needed in their present positions; of these about 6,000

will be transferred to other facilities to perform similar functions and the remainder will be reassigned to new roles. Most, if not all, of the approximately 24,000 to be given new roles have not been reassigned to specific military installations or facilities. All of these figures are approximate and will continue to shift as Defense finalizes its plans.

Defense has not yet prepared detailed economic impact statements for each community affected by these proposals. It is not possible to assess the precise economic impact in each community without publicly disclosing the fact that the facility is being considered for closure. However, Defense could provide some additional data on the size, unemployment rates, and impact on all affected communities without increasing the threat of public disclosure.

Finally, in past base closure actions, Defense has created interagency task forces to coordinate the provision of Federal readjustment assistance. Defense should be requested to create such interagency task forces for announcement simultaneously with the proposed base closure package.

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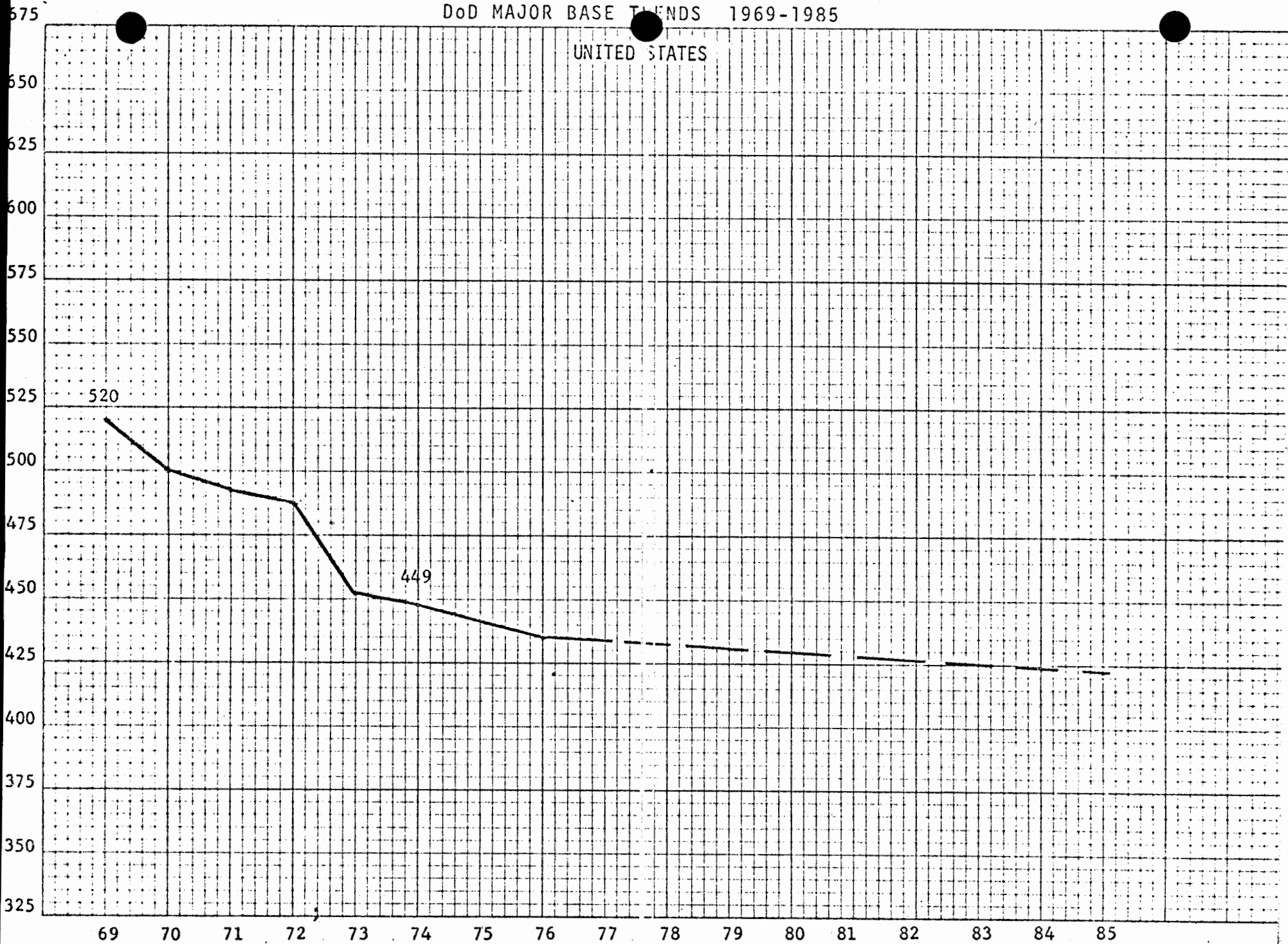

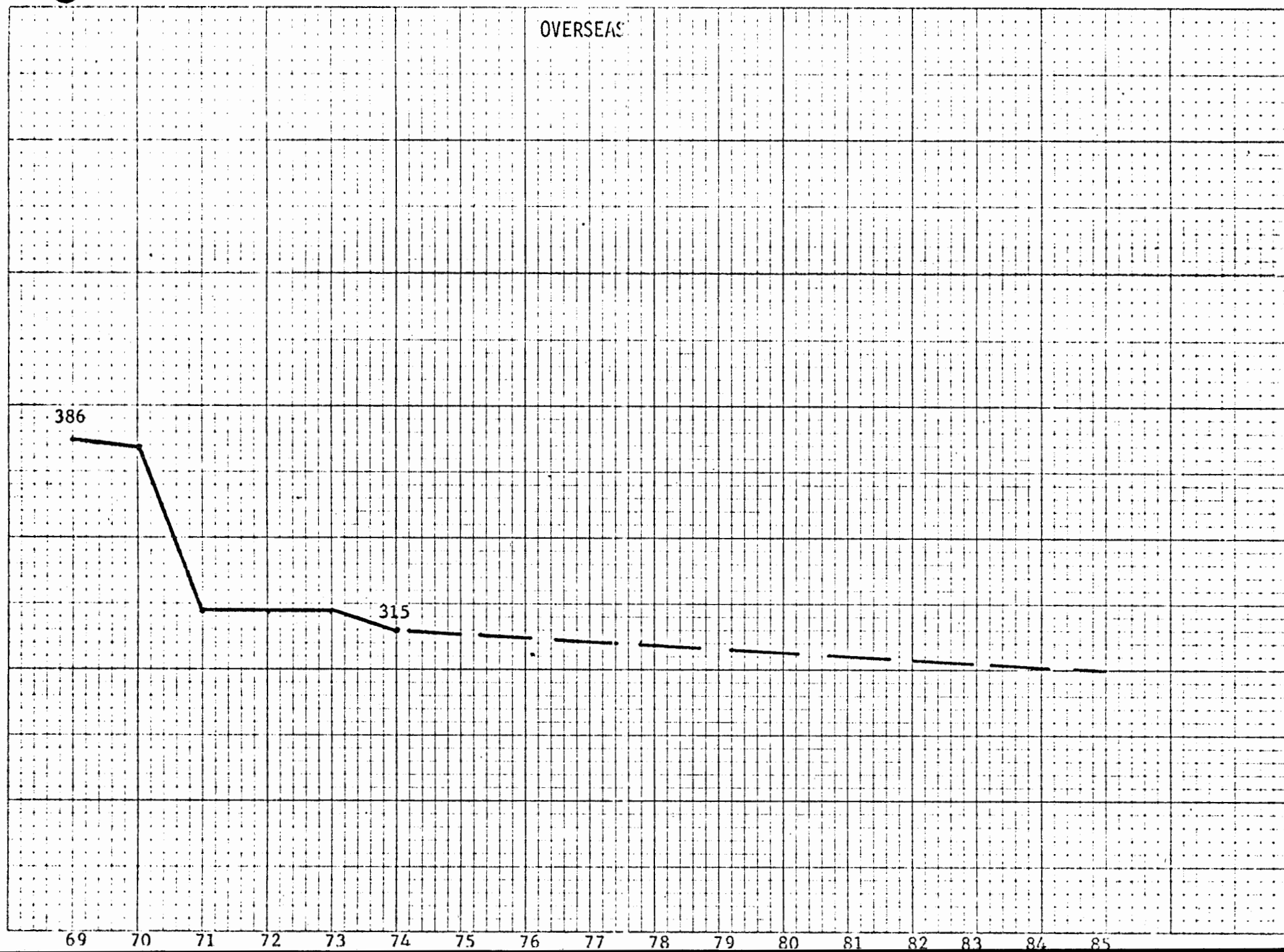
# DoD MAJOR BASE TRENDS 1969-1985

## NEPA AND DOD BASE CLOSURE AND REALIGNMENT ACTIONS

Congress enacted the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA), 42 U.S.C. § 4321 et seq., to encourage harmony between man and his environment and to promote efforts which will prevent damage to the environment and thereby stimulate the health and welfare of man. As a trustee of man's environment, the Department of Defense has established a policy to demonstrate leadership in carrying out its mission of national security in a manner consistent with national environmental policies. Accordingly, we are continually adjusting and refining our administrative practices to minimize or avoid adverse environmental consequences.

NEPA and its implementing guidelines require federal agencies, "to build into their decision-making process, beginning at the earliest possible point, an appropriate and careful consideration of the environmental aspects of proposed action in order that adverse environmental effects may be avoided or minimized and environmental quality previously lost may be restored." 40 C.F.R. § 1500.1 (1974). Recent court decisions emphasize the necessity for even greater attention to this requirement as it applies to base closures and realignments. Consequently, no candidate base closure or realignment action announced for study today will be introduced into the DoD decision-making process until an "appropriate and careful consideration" is given to its environmental consequences.

The Act requires federal agencies to assess the environmental impact of its proposed actions and to prepare a detailed statement, commonly referred to as an environmental impact statement, for those proposals that are considered to major and could significantly affect the quality of the human environment. In addition, such statements are also to be prepared for major proposals that are anticipated to be environmentally controversial under guidelines published by the President's Council on Environmental Quality.

In the preparation of this statement, the Act requires the proponent of the proposal to consult with and obtain the comments from other federal agencies that have jurisdiction by law or special environmental expertise. At this phase, the statement is referred to as the draft environmental impact statement and this is circulated to the public and to federal, state, and local agencies for a minimum 45-day review and comment period. The substantive comments received are to be incorporated into the draft statement filed with the Council on Environmental Quality and published as a final environmental impact statement. No administrative action is to be taken for 30 days following the filing of the final statement with CEQ. The review process requires a minimum of 90 days. The final statement is then to accompany the proposal through the agency's review process in order that the decision makers can give due consideration to environmental factors concurrent with technical, economic and other factors in making the final decision.
