PURPOSE:

Editorial support from Mrs. Pulliam urging either a Ford vote or uncommitted delegates prior to the Arizona State Convention on April 24 would be

most helpful to us.

BACKGROUND:

Mrs. Pulliam's newspapers are the major ones in the State of Arizona. The State Convention to select the 29 delegates to the National Convention will be held on April 24 in Phoenix. There are strong indications that delegates to the State Convention have expressed concern regarding the practicality of committing to a candidate (Reagan) who stands little chance of being nominated.

TOPICS OF DISCUSSION:

- Inquire as to the continued public sentiment regarding the Central Arizona Project (CAP). This is a joint Federal/State-funded water program to provide electrical power in the State -- like the TVA. It's a big issue.
- 2. Stress importance of the upcoming State Convention and the fact that Arizona has produced such effective Republican leaders.
- 3. Mention that Congressman Rhodes will be the Permanent Chairman of the National Convention.
- 4. Encourage Mrs. Pulliam to urge delegates to the State Convention to think in terms of the political realism of November -- that you already have overwhelming delegate commitments to the Convention and that you can attract the Independents and Democratic voters needed to win the General Election.
