I just received a telephone call from Carol Finley in Governor Brown's office in Sacramento, California (916) 445-5106

Governor Brown is sending a telegram to the President and they wanted to read the message to me and alert me to the fact that the telegram was on its way. I told Carol to send it to your attention. The telegram is as follows:

"Dear President Ford:

I appeal to you to use your good offices to bring an immediate settlement to the Cannery strike in California.

Farmers are the innocent third party while management and labor posture with little attempt at serious negotiation.

I invited both sides to come to my office Tuesday morning but before they could arrive the place of negotiations was precipitiously shifted by your Federal Mediation Service to Thursday in Washington. In view of this unusual turn of events, the full responsibility now rests squarely on the shoulders of your Administration.

I urge you to personally intervene without delay.
