<u>Teddy Bailey</u> is an uncommitted delegate from Bristol. The most recent reports on Bailey are that he is leaning Reagan. Bailey is a clerk in a circuit court.

Note: Crockett is the strongest Ford supporter of these three 9th District delegates. Glenn Williams has called all of these delegates three or four times prior to their arrival in Kansas City.
