It is clear from paragraph three of Representative Frank Horton's letter of July 27 (Tab I) that the Citizen's Committee to Commemorate the 20th Anniversary of the Hungarian Freedom Fighters plans to generate considerable attention and publicity to the 20th anniversary events, all of which would feature the President's name on the Committee's letterhead.

Taking domestic considerations into account, I believe the President might wish to send a message to the Hungarian Freedom Fighters Federation on the occasion of the 20th anniversary commemoration. From the viewpoint of foreign policy, I recommend against the President's agreeing to serve as Honorary Chairman -- were he to do so, it would involve a Presidential endorsement of each and everyone of the Federation's pronouncements, publications and activities between now and late October - early November. This would probably evoke an adverse reaction in the Hungarian and Soviet press; this in turn might develop into a controversy in the U.S. press.

If you agree, we will staff forward a recommended message for the President's approval closer to the time of the event, and I would recommend that you revise the reply to Representative Horton to eliminate the link between the 20th and 200th anniversaries and to advise that rather than serving as Honorary Chairman, the President prefers and will look forward to sending a message to the Federation on the occasion of the 20th anniversary.
