Purpose

To authorize payroll deductions for deposit to certain
accounts of employees of the House and Senate.

Agency Recommendations

Office of Management and Budget	Approval
Department of the Treasury	No objection

Discussion

Since 1968 all Federal workers, with the exception of
House and Senate employees, have enjoyed the benefit of
being permitted to designate payroll deductions for
deposit to their checking or savings accounts or for
purchase of shares in credit unions. Senate and House
employees were excluded from coverage by this legislation
at the request of the congressional disbursing officials,
who felt that they could not handle the additional workload
at that time.

The enrolled bill would simply amend the law authorizing payroll deductions to define "agency" to include employees of the House and Senate. The enrolled bill would be implemented by action of the Speaker of the House and the Secretary of the Senate for employees of the respective houses at any time not later than July 1, 1976.

Reference is made to your request for the views of this Department on the enrolled enactment of H.R. 7405, "To amend section 3620 of the Revised Statutes with respect to certain disbursements to be made by banks, savings banks, savings and loan associations, and credit unions."

An Act

To amend section 3620 of the Revised Statutes with respect to certain disbursements to be made by banks, savings banks, savings and loan associations, and credit unions.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That (a) subsection (b) (3) of section 3620 of the Revised Statutes (31 U.S.C. 492(b) (3)) is amended by striking out "(except the Senate and House of Representatives)".

(b) With respect to the Senate, the amendment made by subsection (a) shall take effect whenever the Secretary of the Senate determines the feasibility of compliance with the amendment, but in no event, later than July 1, 1976.

(c) With respect to the House of Representatives, the amendment made by subsection (a) shall take effect whenever the Clerk of the House of Representatives determines the feasibility of compliance with the amendment, but in no event, later than July 1, 1976.
