PRESIDENT ECHEVERRIA, (eh-cheh-veh-REE-ah) WHO TOOK PART

IN THE PARLIAMENTARY MEETINGS HELD IN MEXICO LAST YEAR.

THE UNITED STATES AND MEXICO HAVE LONG ENJOYED

FRIENDLY AND HARMONIOUS RELATIONS. MAINTAINING OUR

CLOSE RELATIONSHIP HAS BEEN ONE OF THE IMPORTANT GOALS

OF MY ADMINISTRATION.

IN FACT, MY FIRST TRIP OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES TO MEET WITH

A CHIEF OF STATE WAS MY MEETING WITH PRESIDENT ECHEVERRIA

WE ARE PREPARED TO CONTINUE OUR CONSULTATIONS AS REGULARLY

AS MEXICO DESIRES, AND ON AS COMPREHENSIVE A BASIS.

I CANNOT OVEREMPHASIZE THE IMPORTANCE WE ATTACH

TO OUR BILATERAL RELATIONS WITH MEXICO.

TRADE,\ TOURISM,

INVESTMENT, BORDER ACTIVITIES, CULTURAL TIES AND THE NARCOTICS

PROBLEM ARE JUST A FEW OF THE AREAS IN WHICH OUR COUNTRIES

ARE INTERDEPENDENT.

I KNOW THAT YOU HAVE A VERY BUSY PROGRAM AHEAD,

AND A VERY EXCITING ONE. IF YOU ARE SUCCESSFUL IN COMPLETING
THE LENGTHY AGENDA WHICH YOU PLAN TO DISCUSS, YOU WILL INDEED

MERIT THE BREATHING SPELL WHICH IS PLANNED FOR YOU IN VAIL,

COLORADO AT THE END OF YOUR VISIT.

AS YOU KNOW, IT'S ONE OF MY FAVORITE PLACES. BUT MY
THOUGHTS WILL BE WITH YOU THEN, AND THROUGHOUT THIS

CONFERENCE, AS YOU CONTINUE YOUR IMPORTANT TASK OF BUILDING
ON THE CORDIAL RELATIONS THAT HAVE LONG EXISTED BETWEEN THE

PEOPLE OF OUR TWO GREAT COUNTRIES.
