Record Presentation

Maestro Antal Dorati opened the National Symphony's 1975 fund drive yesterday by presenting two recordings to First Lady Betty Ford, honorary chairman of the residential drive. The records — the Symphony's recordings of Tchaikovsky's Fourth Symphony and Messiaen's "La Transfiguration de Notre Seigneur Jesus Christ" — recently won the Grand Prix de l'Academie du Disque Francais. The presentation was made at a reception Mrs. Ford held in the White House for 400 members of the Women's Committee of the Symphony.
