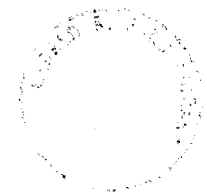

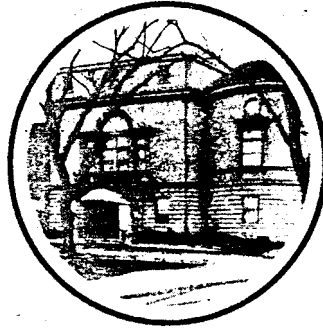

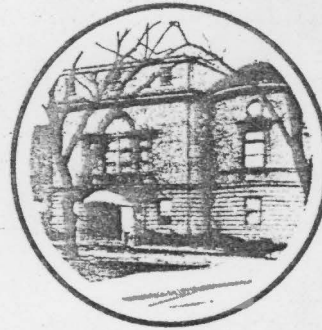

THE CONGRESSIONAL CLUB

*Colors
Blue and Gold*

The original purpose of the Congressional Club when it was formed in 1908 was to provide a non-partisan setting for friendships among the wives of the House and Senate members in Washington, D.C. Although the scope of the club and the breadth of its activities has increased over the years, its purpose remains the same.

Rep. Frank Lowden of Illinois' remark that "Congressional women should have a club for Congressional women" seems to have been the beginning of the founding of the Congressional Club. A group of 25 women at luncheon at the home of Mrs. James Perkins of New York formed the first membership nucleus, and elected Mrs. John Sharp Williams of Mississippi, the wife of the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives, as its first President. The club became more active and increased its membership, in spite of Rep. Williams' belief that women's clubs were unnecessary nuisances.

To this day, Congressional Club members enjoy recalling that on May 20, 1908, the U.S. Congress passed a bill unanimously which granted a Federal charter to the club. The act was accomplished without the opposing presence of Minority Leader Williams, whose wife was keeping him occupied at luncheon. Ever since then the club has functioned as a self-supporting non-profit organization.

The first Congressional Club house was the historic residence of former Senator Gorman of Maryland at 1432 K Street. It opened officially on December 11, 1908, with a reception for President-elect and Mrs. William Howard Taft. A few years later Mrs. John Henderson, the wife of the Senator from Missouri, gave the land and signed notes for \$30,000 for the construction and furnishing of the present club on New Hampshire Avenue. The club house was dedicated in 1914 with a formal reception at which President Wilson was the guest of honor.

The adoption of rules established and broadened the eligibility for membership in the club. Active membership now includes wives of Members of Congress, women Members of Congress, wives of Supreme Court Justices, and wives of members of the President's Cabinet. Associate membership includes their daughters and daughters-in-law. Lifetime Honorary membership is conferred upon the wives of the President, the Vice-President, and the Speaker of the House, or their official hostesses. Many members retain their membership upon leaving Washington and become non-resident members.

From the Club's membership have come six First Ladies: Mrs. Harding, Mrs. Hoover, Mrs. Truman, Mrs. Lyndon Johnson, Mrs. Nixon and Mrs. Ford. Mrs. John Garner, wife of a former Vice-President, was at one time Congressional Club Treasurer. Mrs. Margaret Chase Smith, former Senator from Maine, also served as Treasurer. Former Congresswomen Marguerite Church from Illinois and Catherine Norrell from Arkansas and Congresswoman Lindy Boggs from Louisiana are past presidents of the club, and former Congresswoman Elizabeth Andrews from Alabama is former 2nd Vice-President of the club.

The Congressional Club has been the recipient of a number of beautiful and historic items which are on display. The donors have been club members and other interested and generous friends of the club. Of particular note are the collection of mannequins dressed in replicas of the First Ladies' gowns of the past 100 years and the dolls of many lands presented by the various Embassies in Washington.

Publishing of the Congressional Club Cook Book has been one of the Club's most important projects since 1927. Subsequent editions have appeared periodically, with the 8th being published in 1970. The Bicentennial edition will be published in 1976.

Traditional club activities include a festive Spring breakfast honoring the First Lady, which has been held yearly since 1912; the Founders Day celebration in March, honoring past presidents and new members of the Congressional Club; the Diplomatic Tea for the wives of foreign ambassadors; and receptions honoring high officials in three branches of our government.

The Congressional Club offers a variety of activities, including Red Cross work and other community services in which members serve as volunteers, classes in many subjects, including creative writing, painting, public speaking, languages and flower arranging. The club hosts art shows, children's parties, a Goodwill Industries tour and private parties. There are also weekly club functions which feature presentations by people prominent in many areas of the country's cultural and political life.

A FEW BY-LAWS AND STANDING RULES CLARIFIED

Entertaining Policies

1. The Privilege of entertaining at the Club House shall be confined to members of the Congressional Club only. No member may entertain jointly with a non-member.
2. A club member may sponsor a group of which she is a member provided she underwrites all expenses, is present at the party and personally makes all arrangements with the House Manager.
3. A non-member eligible for membership may attend one Club function as the guest of a member; thereafter, she may not be a guest of members except at private parties.
4. Members shall be held accountable when not cancelling reservations thirty-six hours in advance and shall be billed by the secretary for the amount due.
5. A guarantee of the number to be served must be given not later than the third day before a party, and the number guaranteed must be paid for.
6. All domestic staff are hired by the Club Manager.
7. There shall be no direct tipping, but members may contribute once a year to the Christmas and Welfare Fund which is for exclusive use as remembrances from the Club to the domestic staff of the Club.
8. The Club ball room may be engaged for private parties on available dates provided guests number not less than 50 for a luncheon or dinner, 100 for a reception. An extra charge must be made for additional staff and 6% D.C. tax must be added to this charge. A contract provided by the Manager must be signed by members and the Manager.
9. No fee will be charged for a private party in the daytime, from Monday through Friday, when exclusive use of the Club ball room or Club building is not requested.

Definition of Private Parties:

1. A party where the member engages the Club for exclusive use by arrangement with the Manager.
2. A table where the member arranges for any number of guests through the Manager's office on occasions such as Monday luncheons, Friday luncheons and Sunday buffets.

Manager will be happy to arrange private parties at any time the Club is available.

Definition of Club Party:

Events sponsored by the Club where there are no private tables such as the First Lady Breakfast, the Brunch, Thursday functions and receptions.

Members of committees and officers working on Club affairs and projects may be served a light lunch for \$1.00. The Manager must be notified two hours in advance.

Breakfast for the First Lady:

Quote from Article VIII, section 1 of the By-Laws:

"A Breakfast in honor of the First Lady shall be given each Spring. Guest privileges will be determined by the Executive Board and may, with the approval of the Executive Board, be transferred from one member to another."

The Brunch:

Quote from Article VIII, section 2 of the By-Laws:

"In commemoration of the founding of the Club on March 4, 1908, a Founder's Day program, honoring the past Presidents and new members of the Club, shall be provided on a day as near March 4th as feasible.

This party is attended by members only with the exception of members of the press.

Thursday Programs:

1. There is no limit to guests at Thursday functions unless stated otherwise in the monthly calendar.
2. There is no limit to the number of times a non-eligible guest may be invited to Thursday functions if accompanied by a member.
3. Daughters from 12 years of age and until eligible for associate membership at 18 may attend upon payment of guest fee.
4. Quote from Article II, section 3 of the By-Laws: "A non-resident daughter; and/or a non-resident daughter-in-law may attend Club functions upon payment of the guest fee."

Receptions:

1. Invitations to receptions will specify the number of guests allowed.
2. There is no charge to members. Guests \$1.00. Please call the Club if your guests number over six.

No member shall take any property belonging to the Club from the Club House without the permission of the Executive Committee.

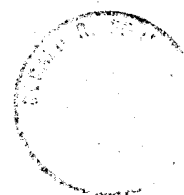

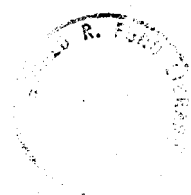

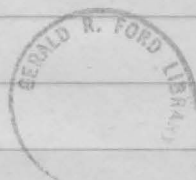

1 large Idaho potato, freshly boiled
2 Tablespoons butter
1 teaspoon salt
