BACKGROUND

Mrs. Ford's trip to Wisconsin,
Chapel Dedication to St. Joan of Arc at Marquette University,
April 5, 1976

The chapel dedicated to St. Joan of Arc at Marquette University served the people in the French village of Chasse for more than five centuries. Historians estimate it was built in the 15th century and perhaps prior to that.

It was acquired in 1926 by Gertrude Hill Gavin, daughter of American railroad magnate James J. Hill. It was moved stone by stone in 1927 to Mrs. Gavin's 50-acre estate in Long Island. Reconstruction plans were carried out by John Russell Pope, the architect who planned the National Gallery in Washington, D.C., and the Frick Museum in New York.

In 1962 the Gavin estate became the property of Mr. and Mrs. Marc B. Rojzman, who donated the chapel to Marquette University. The dismantling of the chapel on Long Island began in June 1964 and required nine months. A fleet of trucks, each truck carrying 40 thousand pounds, brought the chapel stones to Milwaukee and reconstruction on the chapel started in July 1965. It was dedicated on May 26, 1966. According to Marquette University, the chapel is the only Medieval structure in the Western Hemisphere dedicated to its original purpose.

FORD FRIENDS TO VISIT WISCONSIN

GRAND RAPIDS, MICH. -----As many as ²⁵⁰ Grand Rapids Friends of President Gerald R. Ford will pay a neighborly visit to Wisconsin this weekend to say hello, shake hands, and do some people-to-people politicking for their old friend Jerry.

The volunteer organization who call themselves "Friends of the ^{FIRST} Ford Family", will travel by automobile and motor home ~~caravan~~ ^{CONVOY}, fly in in charter planes, scheduled airlines and some private aircraft.

The group of enthusiastic amateurs will make what they call "scatter blitz" stops throughout their entire route, and will hand out buttons, badges, and seedling Michigan Pine trees ~~in~~ appropriately labeled "Grow with President Ford".

In addition, three-to-four foot Michigan Pine trees will be presented to the Milwaukee Zoo, and to officials in Waukesha, Pewaukee, Ft. Atkinson, Oconomowoc, and Madison.

All the Michigan visitors who are arriving by various modes of transportation will converge at Mitchell Aero Inc. facilities at the Milwaukee area's Michell Field, Saturday morning at 11:00 (EST) where they will be met by buses and a band provided by the Wisconsin ^{PFC} COP. President Ford's brothers Tom and Dick will be in the traveling group, and there is a possibility that Betty Ford may be able to join the group ^{Sunday in Madison} ~~sometime during the two day swing.~~

In addition to the planned activities in the cities along the route, the traveling caravan will be using a new technique they call "scatter blitzes". On a given signal relayed throughout the CB radio controlled ^{CONVOY} ~~caravan~~, the entourage will stop and just scatter in all directions shaking hands, saying hi, passing out buttons, ⁵⁰⁰⁰ seedling trees and generally trying to spread good will for the man they are supporting for President--Jerry Ford.



FORD FRIENDS TO VISIT WISCONSIN (continued)

Starting in the Milwaukee area on Saturday, the group will campaign toward Oconomowoc where they will spend the night at the Olympia Princess Lodge, where a barbeque and ^{POLKA PARTY} ~~dance~~ has been scheduled. Sunday morning the group will split up for church services then regroup and campaign in convoy to Madison. They are scheduled to leave Wisconsin for the return trip to Michigan approximately 5:00 p.m.

In addition to homemade hats, ^{SIGNS} ~~sweaters~~, etc, proclaiming their support for President Ford, one Grand Rapids ^{NEIGHBOR} ~~Republican who is~~ (also an announced candidate for Congress) will be driving a memorabilia wagon that will be filled with everything surrounding Gerald Ford's political campaigns from 1948 to the present.

The Michigan group will be made up of all ages including High School age Republicans, and will be considerably larger than the group of 91 Ford Friends who chartered a plane a month ago and flew to Florida for a weekend of campaigning that some Ford staffers say was instrumental in helping to turn that state's primary into a resounding Ford victory.

Local Ford Boosters Taking Another Show on the Road

Grand Rapids supporters of President Gerald R. Ford will take another show on the road April 3, this time to boost their candidate in the April 6 Wisconsin primary.

The idea once again is the brain child of Peter Secchia, local business executive and friend of the President. The plan was discussed and approved in the White House Wednesday night by Ford while Secchia and his wife, Joan, were there for dinner.

The first effort by area Republicans was the Feb. 21-22 trip to Florida where 91 persons campaigned for Ford in a 24-hour blitz of five cities.

Next month's visit will be something of an extravaganza, Secchia said. The group will be joined along the way by First Lady Betty Ford, son Jack and daughter Susan.

A motor caravan will leave Grand Rapids about 7 a.m. April 3, Secchia said. It will consist of automobiles, motor homes, motorcycles and just about everything else with wheels and a motor.

Even horses will be taken along in special trailers to be used in parades in cities along the shoreline of the dairy state.

At about 9 a.m. the same day, a charter airplane will leave Kent County Airport for the Milwaukee-Racine area and another group of persons will take off in small private aircraft. "We call that phase of the operation a 'fly-in,' Secchia said.

It has not been determined where the Ford entourage will begin the campaign swing, nor is it known at what point Mrs. Ford and the two Ford children will join the group. Tentatively, the cities to be visited include Milwaukee, Racine, Sheboygan, Kenosha and Madison.

don't know how long she will stay, although I plan to stay in Wisconsin until we know Ford is the winner," he added. Others from the caravan plan to stay on through April 6, although some will return April 4.

Secchia said he is hopeful that about 200 persons will take part. "We are encouraging whole families to take part."

Some of the group will camp on a large dairy farm in Southwest Wisconsin the night of April 3 and a huge barn dance is planned that evening.

He said it is important to note that the President himself "asked for our help."
