



Ford's Son Brings Presidential Campaign To Southern Vermont

JAMAICA - A quiet-spoken seminarian hit the campaign trail on behalf of his father, the President of the United States, in southern Vermont Monday. Michael Ford, 26, of Gorden Conwell interdenominational seminary in Essex, Mass., said that he had been campaigning only three weeks.

He told a group of schoolchildren and Vermont politicians in a brief speech in Jamaica that he and his wife, Gayle, "have stayed under cover and haven't done much traveling" during the campaign.

"But we feel that we have the responsibility and obligation to our family and our children and our country as American citizens and an obligation to Our Lord as we believe in him to be involved in the political process," he said.

First Visit

This was "Mike" Ford's first visit in Vermont. After landing at the Keene, N.H., airport with a phalanx of Secret Service guards, he went to the Holstein-Friesian offices in Brattleboro. There he

shook hands and signed autographs with employes and local candidates, and made his only political comments during an extremely brief press conference.
