

Plans for Class Day and Commencement May 15, 1975
4th and 5th June, 1975

Task: To develop plans for the Holton-Arms School Class Day and Commencement exercises to be held at 10:00 A.M. on June 4th and 5th, 1975, respectively.

Considerations:

1. Since there are no alternate dates for these two events and, since it is highly desirable ^{that} in the event of good weather, ^{on the outdoor amphitheatre} that they be held outdoors, two plans (fair and rain) must be developed for each of the two activities.

2. The presence of the President and his family at the Commencement exercises will result in more than the usual interest in this year's Commencement. It is expected that

a. The White House Staff Coordinator (Mr. Robin Martin 456-2316) will visit Holton-Arms campus several days before the 5th and make known his requirements for the Presidential Party visit.

b. The President's Party will consist of approximately 10 individuals and will arrive a few minutes before 10:00 A.M. in 5-7 vehicles. ^{These vehicles must be able to park near the amphitheatre or gym}

c. There will be TV and news coverage of the exercises and the reporters should be grouped in one area. The TV crews will probably set up a TV platform for their equipment.

d. The White House Security will be responsible for security of the Presidential Party and for security checks of the area before the President's arrival.

e. The White House Communications staff can supplement the Holton-Arms P.A. system, if needed.

~~3. Both seating of guests and the parking of cars on the campus and adjacent areas is limited.~~ ^{restricting} The maximum number of individuals allowed in the gymnasium because of fire regulations is 750 persons. The present seating capacity in the amphitheatre is approximately 650 persons; ^{however,} the seating capacity of the amphitheatre can be increased to approximately 1300 persons by placing 500 chairs on flat areas within and adjacent to the amphitheatre.

^{The seniors will sit on the stage along with the presiding officer}
4. There are 74 seniors in the graduating class and 35 in the Junior class. The 74 seniors have been allocated 15 ^{guest} tickets each for the amphitheatre ^{or 1110 seats} and 6 each for the gymnasium or 444 seats.

3. Seating:

The maximum number of individuals allowed in the gymnasium because of fire regulations is 750 persons; although there have been occasions when nearly a thousand were seated there. The present seating capacity of the amphitheatre is approximately 850 persons; however, this capacity can be increased to approximately 1350 persons by placing 500 folding chairs in the flat areas between the seats and along the sides.

It is planned for the 74 Seniors and the five principal speakers to sit on the amphitheatre stage or along the north wall of the gym. The Juniors would sit between the amphitheatre stage and the amphitheatre seats or in front of the Seniors if in the gym.

In addition to the 74 Seniors, 50 Juniors, 5 speakers, approximately 50-60 Trustees and Faculty, and 30-40 news reporters, another 12-1300 persons with tickets can be expected in the event of good weather and 6-700 in the event of rain. It is also expected that another 100 may show up without tickets. Provisions must be made for "standing room only" near the amphitheatre.

The Seniors have been allocated 15 tickets each for the amphitheatre or 1110 guests and 6 each for the gym or a total of 1114 guests.

The School has sufficient folding and other types of chairs to seat 750 persons in the gymnasium; however, 500 outside type of chairs must be rented for the amphitheatre.



b. Control of Traffic and Parking:

Parking on the school grounds is limited to 150 cars on the front parking lot, and behind the gym, and around the front circle. Another 120 cars can be parked on Granger Hillside; however, Granger Hill cannot be used in wet weather. Probably another 100 cars can be parked along the shoulders of River Road and along Burdette Road. This results in a total of 370 parking spaces.

The main front road and the back service road must be kept open for emergency vehicles at all times and there must be parking space reserved for the Presidential Party, White House Security, TV vehicles, and invalids.

Visual control of individuals and cars entering the school grounds must be established at the River Road entrance, Amy Lane gate, the path along the east side of Boone Creek, and the path behind the Classroom Building, and the gap in the fence near the Junior High School northeast of the Granger Tract. These areas, except for River Road, can all be controlled from near the amphitheatre.

The individuals controlling the cars and individuals at the River Road entrance must be prepared to make numerous on the spot decisions as well as stopping all vehicles from entering the grounds at 9:55 A.M. The total number of cars entering the campus should not exceed 270, plus the Presidential Party, White House Security, TV vehicles, and invalid





Ford Addresses Susan's Graduating Class

President Ford told 74 Holton Arms School graduates Thursday they were entering "a new era for women in America." He then watched, with tears in his eyes, as his daughter Susan received her diploma.

The President and Mrs. Ford (in the audience) sat patiently until the name Susan Ford was announced. There were tears in his eyes when he awarded his daughter her diploma.

"It was one of those warm, family, non-political occasions which can be such an asset to a politician," Tom Jarriel (ABC) said.

Ford told the graduates Susan had advised him not to talk too long, not to tell any jokes, not to talk about her, and not to talk about the way things were when he was their age.

He also mentioned his fall. "I may have slipped and tumbled down those steps in Salzburg, Austria, last week, but today I assure you I'm walking on clouds," he said (on NBC/CBS film).

Ford (on ABC/NBC film) said: "As young women you are coming of age in an exciting, wonderful time. You have options opened to you -- until recently, they were closed. Before America completes this bicentennial celebration, I hope the Equal Rights Amendment will be part of the United States Constitution. ERA also stands for a new era for women in America, an era of equal rights and responsibilities and rewards."

The Holton Arms School is "one of those exclusive, expensive ones nestled in the woods of suburbia away from the trauma of downtown Washington," Tom Jarriel (ABC) said. "It was at this private academy, which segregates by sex, that the President spoke most forcefully to date on the need for the states to ratify the Equal Rights Amendment for women."

Susan received a fur coat for a graduation present and spent last semester working hard to bring her grade point average up from a C to B level, Tom Brokaw (NBC) reported. -- AP;UPI;Networks (6/5/75)

Ford's Commencement Speech Was His Toughest
Eric Sevareid - CBS

Today was the big one for Gerald Ford, father of four. His confrontations the past few days with Sadat, Franco, the Pope and other non-relatives in Europe -- That was easy. What he had to do this morning was to make a speech to the friends of a teenage daughter. Fathers can make successful speeches to the whole country, to foreign countries, to their own children -- but one to their children's peers, that's the tough one.

Life holds few examples of anticipatory anguish compared to the anguish of a teenager knowing that his or her parent is going to get up in front of the whole school and talk. Robustly healthy teenagers have been known to fall mysteriously ill on such days, some to spread the word that actually the man is not their real father: They were kidnapped in infancy by gypsies and sold.

In our own case long ago these actions were not required because we just caved in and said, all right, if you think my jokes are all that corny and if I am absolutely not with it, I won't make the speech -- cowardly but safe.


Presidents can't just cancel things that way. Mr. Ford actually made the speech, but he finessed it. He just mentioned the themes his daughter, Susan, had ruled out -- like the way things were when he was that age -- a loathesome line for teenagers, aware as they are that no one existed until they came along -- and then he endorsed the Equal Rights Amendment, since this was an all-girl school, and said a new era for American women was aborning.

Maybe so but it probably won't mean a lot unless it's a new era for everybody, including that other sex. Young graduates, high school or college, believe the new eras, because they are the new era and they believe in themselves. We have a theory that one big reason hope springs most eternally in the springtime is that it's graduation time. We've been to quite a few this spring included, and we've never yet seen one that was an occasion of pessimism, of disbelief. Every spring all over this country hope puts down despair and courage makes a fool of fear. And even parents get a new grip on things. "Fourth one down," sighed Mrs. Ford today, the mother of four. She didn't bother to mention that things get harder from high school on. This was a fair, fine day in Washington for a change, and they'll find out anyway on their own. (6/5/75)

SUSAN, 17, WAS ONE OF 74 GRADUATES AT HOLTON-ARMS, AN EXCLUSIVE PRIVATE SCHOOL FOR GIRLS WHICH SHE ATTENDED FOR FOUR YEARS.

AS SHE STEPPED TOWARD THE HEADMASTER TO RECEIVE HER DIPLOMA, HER HEAD TURNED TOWARD HER FATHER AND HER BLUE EYES SNAPPED SHUT AND REOPENED WITH TEARS. THE PRESIDENT CLASPED HER IN HIS ARMS AND HIS EYES ALSO MOISTENED.

IN HIS SPEECH TO THE GATHERING, FORD AGAIN URGED RATIFICATION OF THE EQUAL RIGHTS AMENDMENT.

"BEFORE AMERICA COMPLETES ITS BICENTENNIAL CELEBRATION, I HOPE THE EQUAL RIGHTS AMENDMENT WILL BE PART OF THE U.S. CONSTITUTION," FORD SAID. "FOR ERA ALSO STANDS FOR A NEW ERA FOR WOMEN IN AMERICA -- AN ERA OF EQUAL RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES AND REWARDS."
