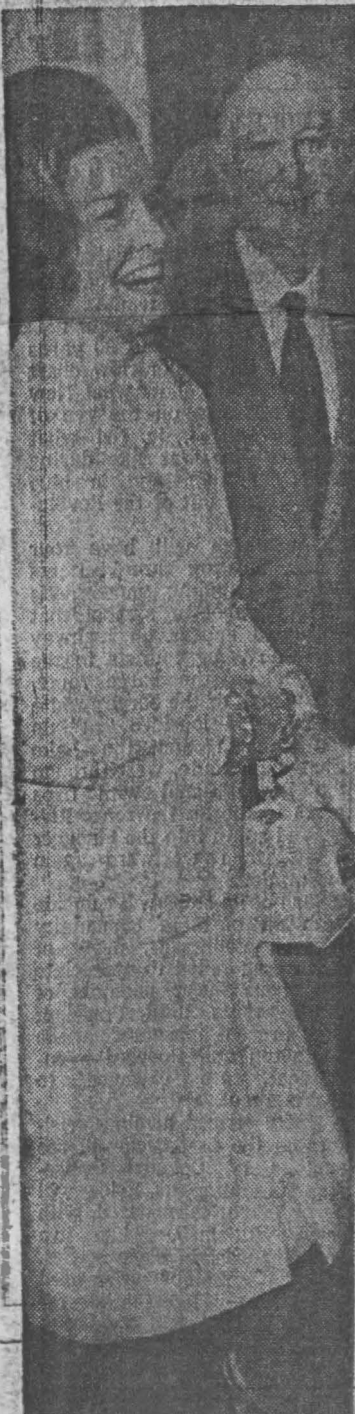
In a white silk blazer suit with peach lapels and blouse by American designer Kasper, Mrs. Ford said she had come "because she was personally interested."
