Dear David:

The other day I was talking to Frank Brodsky who is president of the Golden Slipper Club, an organization with which I am sure you are familiar, and he told me that he has been in touch with the White House. You may have guessed that he has extended an invitation to the President to come to Philadelphia to receive the Club's "Bicentennial Award."

Frank told me that Senator Scott had endorsed the request in writing and that the date is open - subject only to the requirement that it be sometime before mid-May.

There is ample precedent for a President of the United States to appear at the Golden Slipper - Harry Truman was honored in person and Ladybird Johnson and Pat Nixon were both honored while their respective husbands were in the White House.

For the record, Golden Slipper is a largely Jewish organization which operates a non-sectarian charity camp in the Pocono Mountains (800 boys and girls have visited there every year for about a quarter of a century). The other charitable works of the Slipper include scholarships, emergency welfare to victims of tragedy, an extensive program aiding senior citizens and the like.

If there is anything you can do to "push this invitation along" I would consider it a personal favor. The format could be worked out to the President's satisfaction and the political implications I think would be extremely favorable throughout Southeastern Pennsylvania. Thanks and best regards,

The Executive Committee of the Golden Slipper would like to honor you for your service to our country, at a meeting to be held any evening of the following dates:






It was good to hear from you-and I can well understand how busy you have been. One only has to read the paper, or watch the news to see that you are doing a super job.

Our Program Chairman, Joseph H. Ball, suggested I follow up your conversation with him by briefly informing you of the Golden Slipper Club and its programs.

Golden Slipper is Philadelphia's prestigious fraternal and philanthropic organization, comprised of business and professional leaders in this community.

Our best known activity is our camp, consisting of 750 acres of prime land in Bartonsville, high in the Pocono Mountains. It is designed to provide youngsters with a summer camping experience, they might not ever have, due to economic problems. Each year, more than 750 youngsters, regardless of race or religion, attend one of the three, three-week encampments.

In the city, elder citizens, as well as children, participate in the Club's programs. Last year about 3000 senior citizens were provided with theater and other entertainment, while the children were taken to sports events, swimming parties, etc. Each year, almost 200 individual welfare and/or scholarship benefits are provided through the Welfare Committee, who step in quietly to provide quick and efficient help.

We are a "Do-It-Yourself" organization. We do not go to the community for funds, rather our members contribute their time and money to support our programs.

In previous years the Club has honored many prominent people that include the late President Harry S. Truman, U.S. Senator Robert Kennedy and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., as well as Mrs. Lyndon Baines Johnson, Mrs. Richard M. Nixon, the Hon.

Margaret Chase Smith, John Cardinal Krol and many others.

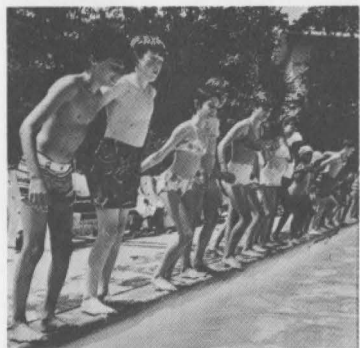
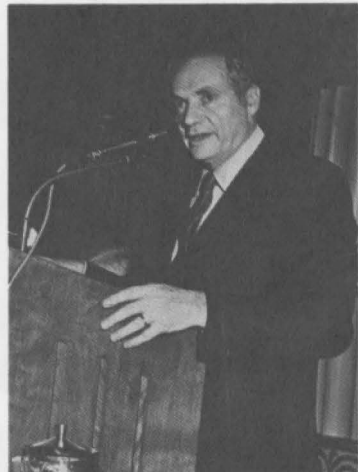

OUR CLUB

Each year over 700 youngsters are sent to our camp in the Pocono Mountains in Pennsylvania for a vacation they otherwise could not afford. Each year many boys and girls are awarded our scholarships so that they can get the education they otherwise may not have been able to obtain. And each year countless numbers of needy and deserving are helped in hundreds of ways by our welfare activities. Plus a productive new projects committee works year 'round, evaluating the needs of the community to see where our efforts can best be placed.

Our founders would be proud to see what has grown from the seed they planted. With over 800 members and an active women's group made up of wives of Slipper members, the work of the Golden Slipper Club is expanding by the day.



The Golden Slipper Camp, founded in 1949, provides needy youngsters of all colors and creeds with the experience of summer camping at its best. The camp is situated on over 700 acres of scenic woodland in Pennsylvania's majestic Pocono Mountains, and its physical facilities are on a par with the finest private camps in the world.

There are three encampments each summer, each of three

weeks duration, so that the maximum number of children can enjoy all that the camp has to offer. Boating, swimming, athletics and a wide range of other activities are all geared to helping boys and girls develop physical skills, self-confidence and self-reliance. Our camp is also open in the off-season, providing memorable weekends for groups like the Big Brothers, P.A.L., and the Boy Scouts.

Most important is this: The Golden Slipper Camp gives these kids the experience of living together with others in a cooperative environment and the experience of learning first-hand that individual dignity, responsibility and friendship transcend race or color.



The activities of Golden Slipper, though diverse, all center around providing help to deserving people through either our camp, welfare or scholarship programs. But the word "help" means many different things. It could mean granting a scholarship to a youngster who has the brains and determination but no funds to put them to work. It could mean providing food and shelter for an elderly couple unable to provide for themselves. It could mean providing a home for a youngster in our group home for "throwaway" children. It could mean a program of aid and activity for "the forgotten people" of our community . . . the aged. It could mean providing a summer vacation for 700 kids of all races and religions at our renowned summer camp. Or it could mean winter camping for deserving groups.

It could mean taking a group of underprivileged kids to the circus or a ball game. It could mean providing food baskets for the hungry at Easter or Thanksgiving or Passover. It could mean an evening of entertainment for a Veterans Hospital. Or it could mean providing shelter for an entire family left homeless.

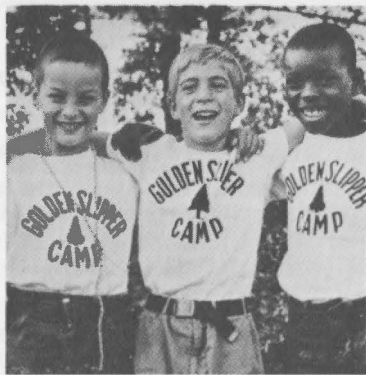

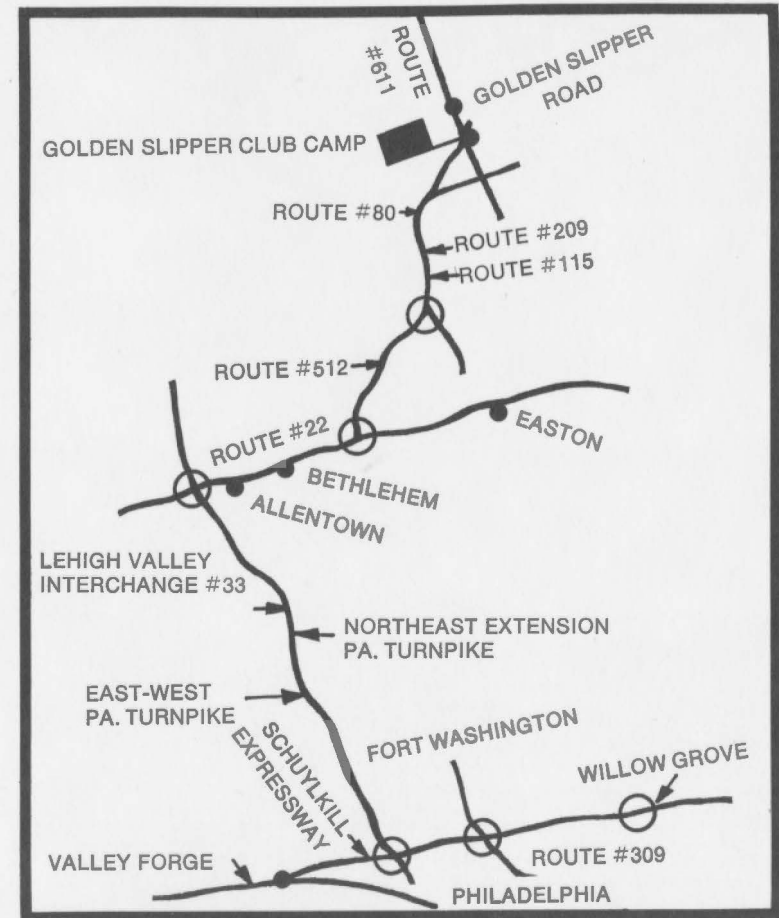
The Federation of Jewish Agencies, in conjunction with the United Fund, is a source of substantial

During a recent conversation with a prospective member, he asked me "Why should I join the Golden Slipper Club? I know all about the fantastic Slipper meetings, but what does the Club really do?"

I was surprised at first that there were people in our city that were not familiar with our charitable activities until I later found out that some of our own members were also not fully aware of Slipper's contribution to the community.

If our Club has any weaknesses, it is probably that we have not fully publicized all that we do to provide assistance to our fellow citizens, both young and old. With most charities and charitable organizations, you mail a check to them and a paid staff performs the work. What makes Slipper so unique is that we do all of our charitable work ourselves, thru the personal and very dedicated involvement of hundreds of our members. Thus, our expenses are much less and a greater part of your dollar is available for aid to the needy.

What other organization do you know, that entertains more than 3500 ~~lonely~~ senior citizens each year, provides monthly outings for over 2500 kids (many from broken homes) provides a camping experience for almost 800 lucky children in one of the most magnificent camp facilities anywhere, and provides instant welfare aid to more than 100 needy families yearly. In addition, for many years, Slipper has provided scholarship assistance to deserving students, including many of our

campers and counsellors, and this year alone, we have already granted over 15 scholarships.

Only upon assuming the office of President of Golden Slipper can anyone fully realize the scope of all of our charitable work. It's not until you sign all of the checks each month that you become aware that in addition to all of the above mentioned activities of Slipper, we also contribute money to crippled children's homes for their entertainment, provide rent deposits so some of our senior citizens may move to better facilities and live out their remaining years in dignity; and purchase medical equipment, beds, eye-glasses, clothing, food and many other much needed items for families who have been referred to us by the Jewish Family Service and other social agencies.

While the Golden Slipper social activities and general meetings are certainly great fun, I truly believe that our main objective is philanthropy and I can assure you that we have never been more active. We are always looking for new projects, (a new committee just being formed will provide aid to Russian Jewish Immigrants arriving in our city) so if you have any ideas, please let us know.

Speaking of activity, there has been another very important benefit that should not be overlooked. Many of the most active leaders in both Jewish and general philanthropy in Philadelphia received their start doing charitable work in Slipper.

If you are not yet actively involved, I urge you to do so.

Attend our Board and General Meetings and let the Slipper office know if you would like to work on any of our committees. I promise you that you will get far more out of Slipper in satisfaction than you will put into it in time and effort. And most important, if you have not paid your annual charitable contribution for the year ... Please do so, we need your help, both actively and financially.

One last point. I would like to give special thanks to some of our members who work behind the scenes to make our meetings so enjoyable and don't always receive the recognition they are entitled to: WALLY NEIBART for his excellent cover drawings for our Slipper Writes, RAY MORRIS who assists with the flowers and table decorations at our meetings, GENE TANZ who supervises the press table, TED REINHART, ALAN SQUIRES and the many members of the Stewards and arrangements committees who supervise the cocktail hour and the dinner at our general meetings and who take care of all the necessary details so that our meetings run so smoothly.

Mrs. Ford's open and frank manner has endeared her to the

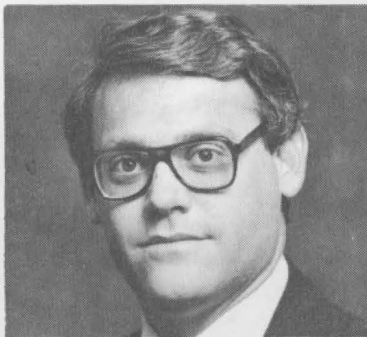
populace and excitement among Slipperites, is running high at the news that she will be attending these ceremonies.

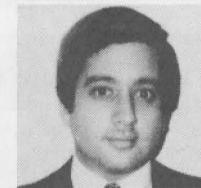

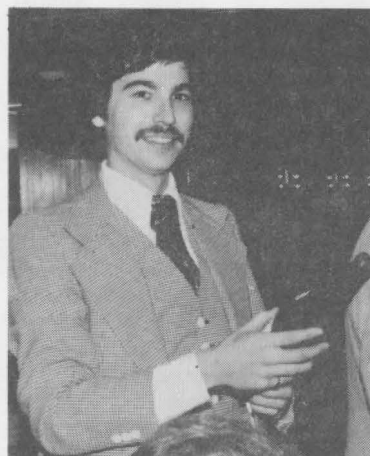
As all good Board Meetings go ... all of our goals were accomplished with a very special PLUS ... a real fun evening.
