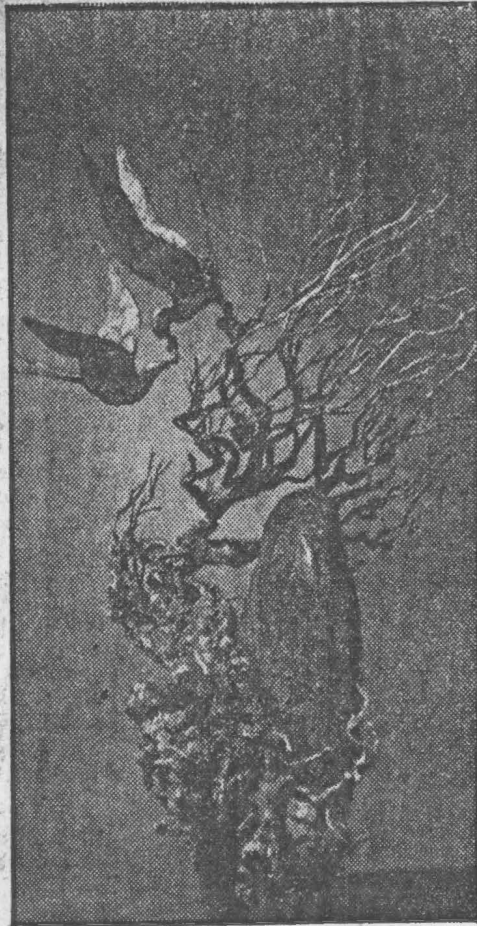

"She's left me," sighed Henry Kissinger, explaining Nancy's no-show at the White House state dinner in Washington Tuesday night for Israel's prime minister, Yitzhak Rabin and his wife, Leah. Actually, Nancy was home recuperating from her latest attack of ulcers, for which she will be operated on soon.

Sen. Jacob Javits came to the dinner, minus embattled Marion. "She couldn't be here — she made some announcement in New York today," he said vaguely. President Ford turned testy at mention of Marion Javits' name. "Aw, let's not talk about that," he said. But Happy Rockefeller was willing to discuss it, provided she had the vice-president's approval. "Let me put it this way," said Happy. "If Marion Javits hadn't been married to Sen. Javits, of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, she wouldn't have had to give up her job." Then she added: "Let me ask my husband if that makes sense."

WASHINGTON (AP) -- ISRAELI PRIME MINISTER YITZHAK RABIN TOLD CONGRESS TODAY HIS GOVERNMENT IS PREPARED TO DEAL WITH PALESTINIAN REPRESENTATIVES WHO ARE PART OF THE JORDANIAN NEGOTIATING THEM. BUT RABIN RULED OUT NEGOTIATING WITH THE PALESTINE LIBERATION ORGANIZATION ITSELF. THE PLO'S CHARTER CALLS FOR ISRAEL'S DESTRUCTION, HE SAID, AND "NO HONEST BEING CAN BLAME US FOR REFUSING TO COOPERATE IN OUR NATIONAL SUICIDE."

ONLY WHEN THE ARAB STATES ACCEPT ISRAEL "WILL THE PALESTINIAN ISSUE BE CONSTRUCTIVELY AND FINALLY TACKLED," HE SAID.

RABIN'S SPEECH TO A JOINT MEETING OF THE HOUSE AND SENATE, PARALLELING AN APPEARANCE LAST NOV. 5 BY EGYPTIAN PRESIDENT ANWAR SADAT, WAS INTERRUPTED ONLY FOUR TIMES FOR APPLAUSE. THERE WERE DOZENS OF EMPTY SEATS IN THE SECTION RESERVED FOR HOUSE MEMBERS.

SEN. JAMES ABOUREZK, D-S.D., THE FIRST SENATOR OF ARAB DESCENT, WAS ABSENT. "HE JUST WASN'T EXCITED," SAID A SPOKESMAN FOR ABOUREZK "THERE WAS NO SPECIAL BOYCOTT."

IN HIS SPEECH RABIN SAID THE CORE OF THE ARAB-ISRAELI CONFLICT IS THE REFUSAL OF THE ARAB COUNTRIES "TO RECONCILE THEMSELVES TO THE RIGHT OF EXISTENCE OF ONE, SMALL, VIABLE, SOVEREIGN JEWISH STATE IN THE LAND OF OUR PEOPLE'S BIRTH."

IN ORDER TO ACHIEVE PEACE, HE SAID, "ISRAEL IS READY TO GIVE UP MUCH AND COMPROMISE MUCH ON TERRITORY." ALONG THESE LINES, RABIN SAID, HE IS READY TO MEET WITH ANY ARAB HEAD OF GOVERNMENT AT ANY TIME, AT ANY PLACE.

FORD AND RABIN STOOD BAREHEADED AS THE U.S. ARMY BAND PLAYED THE NATIONAL ANTHEMS OF THE UNITED STATES AND ISRAEL.

WHITE HOUSE PRESS SECRETARY RON NESSEN SAID AN 8:30 A.M. EST DECISION TO HOLD THE CEREMONIES OUTSIDE WAS BASED ON A WEATHER FORECAST THAT CALLED FOR MIST AND OCCASIONAL SPRINKLES.

WASHINGTON (AP) -- ISRAELI PRIME MINISTER YITZHAK RABIN, ON A 12-DAY VISIT HERE, WILL CONCENTRATE ON HOLDING ON TO AMERICAN DIPLOMATIC SUPPORT AND RESTORING THREATENED MULTIMILLION-DOLLAR U.S. AID CUTS.

RABIN LEFT JERUSALEM WITH NO SPECIFIC PLANS TO OFFER PRESIDENT FORD, BUT ISRAELI OFFICIALS SAID THE PRIME MINISTER WOULD OUTLINE GENERAL THOUGHTS ON A JOINT STRATEGY FOR THE MIDDLE EAST. RABIN AND FORD MEET TODAY WHEN THE PRIME MINISTER ARRIVES AFTER A DAY IN PHILADELPHIA.

I BEHIND RABIN'S CALL FOR A JOINT STRATEGY, ISRAELI OFFICIALS SAY, WILL BE A MAJOR EFFORT TO STOP ANY EROSION OF AMERICAN SUPPORT FOR HIS GOVERNMENT'S TOUGH POSITION CONCERNING MIDDLE EAST NEGOTIATIONS.

WHAT PARTICULARLY CONCERNS THE JERUSALEM GOVERNMENT ARE SIGNS THE UNITED STATES MIGHT CONSIDER SOME NEW INITIATIVE THAT WOULD BRING THE PALESTINE LIBERATION ORGANIZATION INTO THE PROCESS. ISRAEL IS INTRANSIGENT CONCERNING THE PLO, WHICH IT CLAIMS IS A MURDEROUS ORGANIZATION WITH NO LEGITIMATE POLITICAL STANDING.

BESIDES HIS DESIRE TO KEEP THE PLO OUT, RABIN'S OTHER MAIN CONCERN DURING HIS TRIP WILL BE TO OBTAIN MORE U.S. AID. HIS GOVERNMENT WAS SHOCKED TO LEARN LAST WEEK THAT PRESIDENT FORD WAS PROPOSING A \$500 MILLION CUT IN MILITARY AID FOR THE JERUSALEM GOVERNMENT IN 1977.

I THAT REPRESENTS A MAJOR BLOW TO ISRAEL, WHICH HAD RECEIVED \$1.5 BILLION IN ARMS ASSISTANCE IN THE PROPOSED 1976 BUDGET.

ISRAELI OFFICIALS SAY THE CUT WILL SERIOUSLY HURT ISRAEL'S MILITARY POSITION AND INCREASE TEMPTATION FOR AGGRESSION BY THE ARAB WORLD.

WASHINGTON (UPI) -- AFFIRMING "AMERICA'S COMMITMENT TO ISRAEL'S SURVIVAL", PRESIDENT FORD GREETED PRIME MINISTER YITZHAK RABIN ON THE SOUTH LAWN OF THE WHITE HOUSE TODAY WITH A "SHALOM" WELCOME.

"LET US SEIZE THIS HISTORIC OPPORTUNITY TO TRANSLATE HOPE INTO REALITY," FORD SAID AS HE STOOD BAREHEADED IN THE RAIN TO MEET RABIN.

"ACCORDING TO JEWISH TRADITION, RAIN MEANS BLESSING," RABIN TOLD 3,000 PERSONS STANDING UNDER UMBRELLAS AT THE OUTDOOR ARRIVAL CEREMONY. HE PROMISED HIS NATION "WILL DO ALL THAT CAN BE REASONABLY DONE" TO ACHIEVE PEACE.

FORD AND RABIN MOVED INTO THE WHITE HOUSE AND PLUNGED DIRECTLY INTO TALKS THAT U.S. OFFICIALS SAID WOULD CENTER ON FORD'S DETERMINATION TO GET ARAB-ISRAELI PEACE NEGOTIATIONS GOING AND ON ISRAEL'S PUSH FOR CONTINUED MULTIBILLION DOLLAR AMERICAN AID.

FORD, WHO HAD OVERRULED AIDES AND DECIDED AGAINST MOVING THE WELCOME CEREMONY INDOORS, GREETED RABIN WITH A JEWISH "SHALOM" -- PEACE -- WELCOME.

HE SAID THE OFFICIAL'S THREE-DAY WASHINGTON VISIT GAVE HIM THE OPPORTUNITY "TO REAFFIRM" THE U.S.-ISRAELI ALLIANCE.

THE PRESIDENT SPOKE OF THE TWO NATIONS' "ENDURING FRIENDSHIP... AMERICA'S COMMITMENT TO ISRAEL'S SURVIVAL" AND THE NECESSITY FOR BOTH TO JOIN IN A DRIVE FOR "A PEACEFUL, COMPREHENSIVE AND JUST SOLUTION" TO PROBLEMS IN THE MIDDLE EAST.

"OUR TASK REMAINS URGENT," FORD SAID.

"TODAY OUR COOPERATION IS MORE NECESSARY THAN EVER IN THE QUEST FOR AN ENDURING PEACE. WE HAVE ESTABLISHED A GOOD BASIS FOR FORWARD MOVEMENT. WE HAVE TAKEN THE FIRST STEP."

WASHINGTON (UPI) -- PRESIDENT FORD MAY COUNTER AN UNFAVORABLE UNITED NATIONS VOTE ON ISRAEL WITH A NEW MIDDLE EAST INITIATIVE INCLUDING A PERSONAL VISIT TO THE TROUBLED AREA IN LATE APRIL.

A SENIOR OFFICIAL ABOARD SECRETARY OF STATE HENRY KISSINGER'S FLIGHT FROM EUROPE YESTERDAY SAID THERE IS A "50-50 CHANCE" THE PRESIDENT WILL VISIT ISRAEL, EGYPT, SAUDI ARABIA AND SEVERAL OTHER MIDDLE EAST COUNTRIES THIS SPRING.

PRESIDENTIAL PRESS SECRETARY RON NESSEN SAID THAT DURING EGYPTIAN PRESIDENT ANWAR SADAT'S VISIT TO WASHINGTON LAST NOVEMBER FORD HAD "AGREED IN PRINCIPLE TO VISIT THE MIDDLE EAST" BUT THERE IS NO SPECIFIC TIMETABLE OR PLANS.

THE PRESIDENT WAS EXPECTED TO BROACH THE IDEA TO ISRAELI PRIME MINISTER YITZHAK RABIN WITH WHOM HE BEGINS WHITE HOUSE TALKS TOMORROW.

THE UNITED STATES IS EXPECTED TO VETO A PROPOSED SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION ON ISRAEL BUT AMERICAN FOREIGN POLICY OFFICIALS DO NOT WANT THE VETO TO LEAVE THE IMPRESSION WASHINGTON HAS LOST INTEREST IN PROMOTING MIDDLE EAST PEACE.

WHITE HOUSE OFFICIALS SAID PRIVATELY FORD WANTS ISRAELI COOPERATION ON PEACE DIPLOMACY BUT THE ISRAELIS APPARENTLY WANT TO STALL ANY ACTION UNTIL IT IS CERTAIN WHO WILL WIN THE AMERICAN PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION IN NOVEMBER.

THE SENIOR OFFICIAL SAID AN EXPANDED INTERNATIONAL EFFORT ON ISRAEL COULD INVOLVE RECONVENING THE GENEVA CONFERENCE ON THE MIDDLE EAST, OR A PREPARATORY CONFERENCE TO THE GENEVA FORUM.

ONE OBJECT WOULD BE TO INVOLVE THE SOVIET UNION MORE INTIMATELY IN THE MIDDLE EAST PEACE EFFORTS.

BEFORE LEAVING TEL AVIV, RABIN SAID RECONVENING OF THE GENEVA PEACE CONFERENCE WAS THE BEST WAY TO MOVE TOWARD PEACE.

"IF THE OTHER PARTIES -- PARTICULARLY THE SOVIET UNION -- ARE REALLY INTERESTED IN ADVANCING THE CAUSE OF PEACE," RABIN SAID, "I BELIEVE THIS IS THE BEST FORMULA TO MOVE FORWARD."

HE ALSO SAID ISRAEL WAS WILLING TO MAKE "FAR-REACHING TERRITORIAL COMPROMISES" IN RETURN FOR PEACE WITH THE ARABS.

WHITE HOUSE OFFICIALS SAID FORD WAS GOING TO UNUSUAL LENGTHS TO DEMONSTRATE U.S.-ISRAELI TIES DURING RABIN'S VISIT. BESIDES THE STANDARD STATE DINNER AT THE WHITE HOUSE FOR RABIN, THE OFFICIALS SAID, THE PRESIDENT WILL PAY RABIN THE UNUSUAL COURTESY OF GOING TO DINE AT THE ISRAELI EMBASSY.

WASHINGTON (UPI) -- ISRAELI OFFICIALS ARE DISAVOWING PUBLISHED REPORTS THEIR GOVERNMENT WANTS TO WAIT UNTIL AFTER THE U. S. ELECTIONS THIS FALL BEFORE ACCEPTING AMERICAN EFFORTS TO OBTAIN A MIDDLE EAST PEACE.

ISRAEL PRIME MINISTER YITZHAK RABIN IS IN THE UNITED STATES TO LOBBY FOR HIS COUNTRY'S INTERESTS. HE MEETS TODAY WITH PRESIDENT FORD, WHO HAS INDICATED HE MAY TRAVEL TO THE MIDDLE EAST THIS YEAR.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE ISRAELI EMBASSY WAS ASKED ABOUT REPORTS ISRAEL WILL STALL U. S. PEACE EFFORTS BECAUSE AN ADMINISTRATION MORE FAVORABLE TO ISRAEL'S INTERESTS MAY BE ELECTED THIS FALL. THE SPOKESMAN SAID RABIN WILL URGE THE EARLIEST POSSIBLE RECONVENING OF THE GENEVA CONFERENCE.

"INDEED, THE MAIN PURPOSE OF THE VISIT IS TO TRY TO WORK OUT A COORDINATION OF ISRAELI AND U. S. POLICY FOR 1976 AS IT IS OUR VIEW IT DOES NOT MATTER WHETHER THIS IS AN ELECTION YEAR OR NOT," HE SAID.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT EQUALLY HIGH ON RABIN'S AGENDA WAS THE QUESTION OF U. S. MILITARY ASSISTANCE TO ISRAEL. "WE BELIEVE WE SHOULD RECEIVE ASSISTANCE WHICH WOULD BE SUFFICIENT TO ENABLE US TO CONTINUE TO DEFEND OURSELVES."

AFTER TALKS WITH FORD AND SECRETARY OF STATE HENRY KISSINGER TODAY AND A STATE DINNER IN HIS HONOR TONIGHT, RABIN WILL ADDRESS CONGRESS TOMORROW.

"ISRAEL SHALL WIN THE PEACE WITH THAT SAME CONFIDENCE OF SPIRIT THAT CAME OUT OF THIS HISTORIC PLACE 200 YEARS AGO."

RABIN FLEW INTO PHILADELPHIA ON THE FIRST LEG OF A 12-DAY VISIT TO THE UNITED STATES. HE WAS GREETED AT PHILADELPHIA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT BY PENNSYLVANIA GOV. MILTON SHAPP, PHILADELPHIA MAYOR FRANK RIZZO AND A SCORE OF OTHER DIGNITARIES.

RABIN WAS SCHEDULED TO STAY IN PHILADELPHIA TONIGHT BEFORE GOING TO WASHINGTON EARLY TUESDAY TO MEET WITH FORD AND SECRETARY OF STATE HENRY KISSINGER.

RABIN STRESSED THE INDEPENDENCE THEME IN BRIEF TALKS AT THE AIRPORT AND THE LIBERTY BELL BEFORE GOING TO THE ACADEMY OF MUSIC TO SPEAK TO MORE THAN 5,000 PERSONS IN A PROGRAM ARRANGED BY THE JEWISH COMMUNITY RELATIONS COUNCIL.

"THE SPIRIT THAT PUT PHILADELPHIA ON THE MAP OF HISTORY DERIVES FROM THE SPIRIT THAT PUT JERUSALEM ON THE MAP OF HISTORY," RABIN SAID. "BOTH NAMES ARE SYMBOLS OF A CIVILIZATION."

Mrs. Kissinger said she is "startled by women 'doing their own thing.'" She added, "I find this unrealistic. One has responsibilities to family and community. If everyone repudiates these responsibilities our society is in trouble."

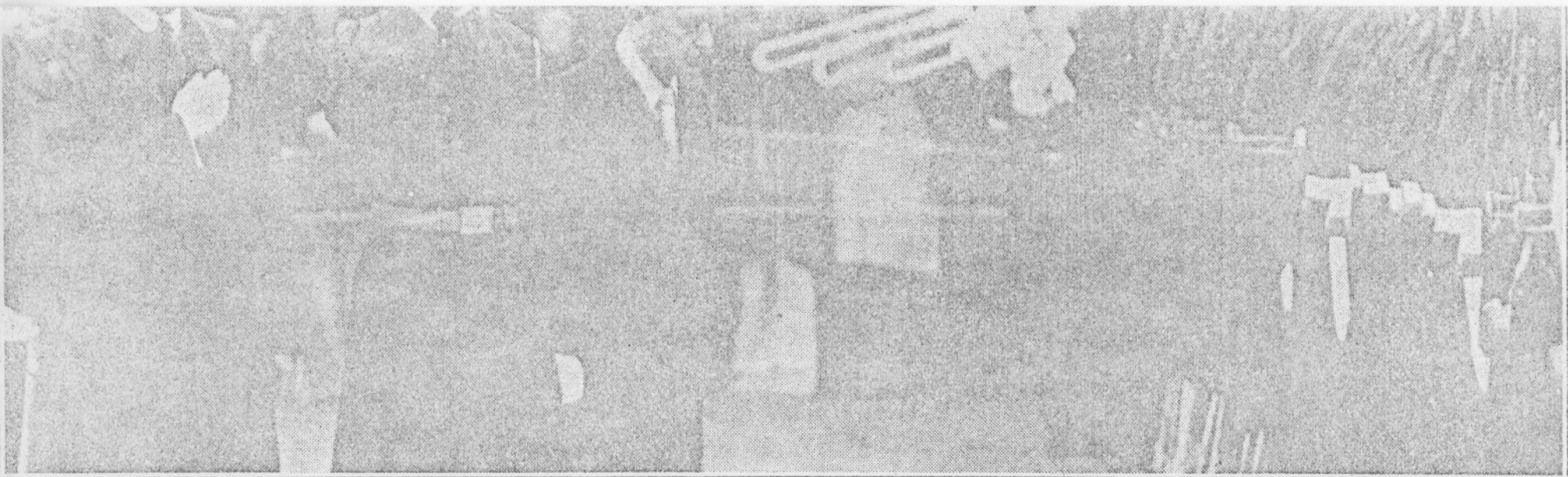

Rabin said Israel was ready to negotiate the Palestinian issue "within the geographical and political context of peace with Jordan" which would include Palestinians in the Jordanian delegation.

HE ADDED that Israel is ready to "give up much and compromise much on territory" in negotiations whose aims are peace and reconciliation. Recalling that when Egyptian President Anwar Sadat addressed Congress last October he "wisely declared" that there is no substitute for person-to-person talks, Rabin said. "I wish that he would direct these words to me as well as to you, the Congress of the United States. I would then know that the work of true peace-making has finally begun."

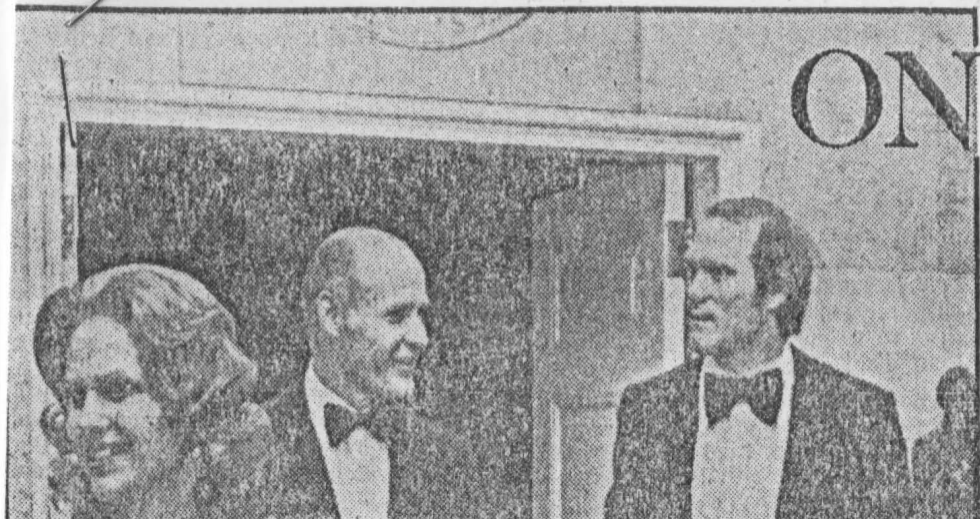
He said the "vision and essence of Zionism" is "the principle that the Jewish people should preserve its integrity and restore its national existence in its own homeland, despite the holocaust of history." He said the core of the Arab-Israeli conflict "is the refusal of the Arab countries to reconcile themselves to the right of existence of one, small, viable, sovereign, Jewish State in the land of our people's birth; by Jewish State I mean an independent, democratic society, secular in the equality of all its citizens Jew and non-Jew alike, before the law and founded upon historic Jewish values."

Rep. Henry A. Waxman (D. Calif.) described Rabin's address as an "excellent explanation of the

Israeli position and a reminder that the future of Israel and the U.S. are inextricably tied together". He added: "I was pleased that Rabin received such an enthusiastic welcome and reaction by my colleagues. Rabin made it clear that the attack against Israel in the United Nations was really an attack on democracies . . ."

Rabin met several times privately with a group of "selected" journalists for both background material on Israel and on-the-record interviews. However, as is usual when Israeli leaders visit here, Jewish press representatives from American, Canadian and South African Jewish publications are not allowed to attend.

Rabin also addressed a National Press Club luncheon, the first since he has been Prime Minister. Mrs. Rabin later told National Press Club president Robert A. Alden that his introduction of her husband was the "nicest one I've ever heard."
