INFORMAL RON NEWSMAN BRIEFING
November 3, 1975

VICE PRESIDENT: Vice President saw the President this morning at 10:30 for about 20 minutes. During that meeting, he handed him his letter declaring he will not be a candidate for VP in 1976. He had talked with the President about this during the last few days. President feels the letter speaks for itself. There is a complete understanding between the President and the VP. There will be no response letter.

PRESS CONFERENCE: Will be at 7:30 PM tonight in the East Room. President will have a statement at the beginning of the PC. Ron was asked if it would be on personnel -- Ron's answer was that was a good guess. Ron suggested that the PC be in the East Room because there will be a larger crowd than usual, it is anticipated.

CHINA TRIP: No change in the dates of the China trip. Exact departure and arrival time not ready yet.

PFC: No change at the Committee is anticipated. Ron again indicated that he would be "dumbstruck" if any change came about. President is still very pleased with Callaway's office and its operation.

SCHLESINGER/COLBY ET AL: Ron was asked if Rumsfeld was being considered as Schlesinger's replacement and he said he couldn't comment on any personnel changes that hadn't been announced. Was asked several different questions on same subject. But, his answer was the same.

CHURCH LETTER: President released a letter which he sent to Church committee dated October 31 regarding releasing the information which the White House has sent to the Church Committee and the Justice Department. If it were made public it would be harmful to security, foreign policy and could possibly endanger the lives of persons. President feels he has fulfilled the requirement of the Congress and the Justice Department. The letter was sent to the Committee with the understanding that it would be a private communication. President has decided he would like to have his full views known on this matter. Similar ltr will probably be sent to other members of Senate.

PERSONNEL CHANGES: Rumsfeld and Bush nominations signed by the President today and will go to the Hill this afternoon or tomorrow. Under Secretary Clemens will be acting Secretary of Defense until Rumsfeld is confirmed. Colby will continue to run the CIA until Bush is confirmed. President talked to Colby at 8:00 AM and Schlesinger at 8:30 AM on Sunday morning. Nothing on Gen. Allen leaving NSA or General Graham leaving DIA, as reported in this morning's paper. Colby and Schlesinger were offered other high Administration positions and they both declined.

CHINA TRIP: President is looking forward to his upcoming trip this year to PRC. Planning for the trip is going on. As soon as we have completed the detailed arrangements, we will make an announcement. Advance team has not left as yet. No changes in the timing of the trip. Advance team will leave before too long.

VICE PRESIDENT: VP told the President when he had his regular weekly meeting with him last Tuesday. They met for one hour and 5 minutes. At that meeting, they only discussed the VP getting off the ticket. The President's speech at the NPC on NYC was not discussed. If anyone feels the need to explore the VP's letter further, they must contact the VP. The bipartisan leaders met last night and member after member told the President they would support whatever team the President selected. Byrd expressed concern about Schlesinger's departure from DOD.

ELECTION RETURNS: Presidential quote -- "Although most of the East's elections primarily involved local issues and the results in Republican versus Democratic contests were mixed, I think it is a fair conclusion from this sampling that the Republican party is alive and well across the country." RN went on to outline where some of the Republicans won and how many seats, etc..

CHURCH COMMENTS: RN said that Church seems to be more interested in headlines than conducting Congressional investigations. George Bush has an outstanding record as a former Congressman, Ambassador to the UN and our representative in the PRC. President feels he will do an outstanding job at the CIA. President doesn't feel that service as an official of a political party doesn't and shouldn't disqualify someone from public service.

COLBY: President met this morning with Colby (15 minutes) and asked him to remain on as Director until his successor was confirmed and qualified. Colby agreed to do so. Colby will still be able to testify before the Church committee if he is actively the Director or has been replaced by his successor.

SCOWCROFT: Nothing on a deputy for Scowcroft. Scowcroft has asked the Counsel's office on a ruling on whether he has to retire from the Military to be Asst. to the President for Natl. Security Affairs and is waiting for their response.

CHINA: President still expects to go to China and the planning for the trip continues. Advance team has not left yet. Advance schedule for Paris and China is being revised. Don't know whether Bush will remain for trip.

SCHLESINGER: He and the President are in agreement with the present American position and in a large degree he was the author of the SALT talks.

PERSONNEL DECISION: President notified some of the people involved in his decisions last Saturday (a week ago Saturday) and then during the week, he met with another group and told them of his plans to replace Schlesinger and Colby.

HAK: President will continue to see the Secretary of State on a daily basis until the new procedure is worked out.

RON NESSEN BRIEFING
NOVEMBER 6, 1975

FUTURE TRAVEL: President will go to Atlanta on the 14th of November for a local press conference and a Republican fund raiser. He will also go to North Carolina on the same trip. It hasn't been decided whether the press will return here before going on to Paris. The President will return to Andrews AFB prior to departure for Paris.

On November 11, the President will go to the Iwo Jima Memorial for a ceremony, flag pageant and parade. He will have brief remarks. He will depart the WH shortly before 11:00 AM and return by Noon.

REVENUE SHARING MTG.: President met this morning with members of congress to discuss the early enactment of general revenue sharing which is due to expire December 31, 1976. The White House supports the current formula. The President's proposal would extend the GRS for 5 3/4 years and it will increase by \$150 million each year.

V. P. PRESS CONF.: President telephoned the VP after the PC. He congratulated the VP on the good job (excuse me, super job) he did, said it was excellent and also thanked the VP for the delightful time at dinner last night and said we had a great time. The Vice President told RN that he wants the press to know that he supports the President and expects him to be nominated. He also expounded on his comments about not being able to campaign for the President. He is limited to either a cash contribution or a limit of his services to \$1,000. He is also restricted from using government funds or RNC funds to campaign on behalf of the President. When he campaigns for the President, the expenses will be paid for by the President Ford Committee and he intends to speak at fund raisers and other events in support of the President's candidacy.

W. P. I. - Went up 1.8% in October. There were a number of technical and one shot factors which caused the increase. One of the factors was the new car prices which went up during this reporting period.

CHINA -- The same information we've been putting out this week. President still expects to go. There are technical and scheduling matters that are being discussed.

ENERGY BILL: Conferees are still putting together a bill and White House personnel are working with them. Some of the things being discussed are the result of an increase in imports, a decrease in domestic production and an increase in fuel consumption. If a bill arrives at the White House that has these factors in it, the President would veto it; however, we are hoping that a compromise can be worked out that would be acceptable.

TRAVEL PLANS: Charleston, W. Va. - President Departs AAFB - 5:30 PM; Press Plane check in - 4:45 PM; - Press Plane departure - 5:15 PM; Air Force One arrives - 6:25 PM; Air Force One departs - 9:25 PM; Air Force One arrives AAFB - 10:20 PM (This trip will be tomorrow, November 11)

Friday - November 14 - Press Plane departs AAFB 8:15 AM; President will deliver convocation address at North Carolina Central University in Durham at 10:30 AM. Then go to Raleigh to Royal Villa Hotel to attend a GOP fund raising luncheon at 12:30 PM. He will then fly to Atlanta for a regional televised press conference and GOP fund raising dinner. Will try to get press plane out of Atlanta one hour ahead of the President and back to Andrews so that those who aren't going to Paris can deplane, with the remainder of the press corps boarding another plane for Paris. If this isn't possible, press plane will go directly from Atlanta to Paris. Sign up on the sheet if you want to go to Atlanta, so the decision can be made about flying directly from Atlanta or returning to AAFB. Decision will be made later today. Press plane will depart from AAFB around 11:00 PM for Paris. If departure from Atlanta, will be at 10:00 PM.

MANSFIELD ET AL: Meeting was requested by Mansfield and other Senators to discuss the legislation proposed by the Senate Banking Committee on aid to NYC. Meeting began at 8:30 AM and lasted for 1 hour and 15 minutes. President reviewed the legislation. He hasn't changed his mind about federal aid to NYC. President felt it was a good meeting with a good exchange of views. President will continue to monitor the situation. He is encouraged by the progress NYC is making.

BOSTON TRIP: No decision yet as to who will pay for the Boston trip. We should have an answer to that sometime early tomorrow or Wednesday.

RON NESSEN'S TRIP: Ron is in SFO speaking to the National Association of Realtors. The trip is being paid for by the federal government. According to the Government code of ethics, Ron can't permit NAR to pick up the tab for his speech.

CHINA: President is still going to China. Plans are still continuing. Don't know when the advance team will leave.

DON RUMSFELD: Still on White House payroll. Will continue to be until he is confirmed. He is Assistant to the President.

TAX BILL: President still feels that there is some indication that there will be a spending ceiling and if so, he will have to veto the legislation.

N. Y. C. - President's position is unchanged. Is encouraged by the work which the city and state officials are doing to solve their own problem.

SENATE RESOL. /UN: President has no objection to Congressional resolution reassessing U. S. role in the UN. President has strongly condemned the UN resolution as passed by the UN because zionism is not racism. It endangers the UN's functions, which is a forum for a settlement of disputes between countries which it has done for years.

CHINA: Nothing new on the trip except the advance team will leave immediately after the return from Paris.

BUSH/CIA: President is not considering withdrawing his nomination of George Bush to head the CIA. He feels Bush is eminently qualified for the position and the fact that he at one time was the Chairman of the RNC has nothing to do with the position at the CIA, and shouldn't enter into consideration.

BLACKBURN NOMINATION: President will send up a new nomination, inasmuch as the Blackburn nomination was defeated in Committee. President was unaware of the facts which came out of the hearing. They didn't show up in the FBI check that was run on Blackburn.

MORTON: White House feels it would be most unfortunate if he were held in contempt of Congress because he is fulfilling his legal obligations under the statute.

THORN: Will have a readout after the lid comes off at 3:00 PM.

CHINA TRIP: Peking from December 1 through 5 (departing Wash. on Nov. 29); Indonesia - December 5-6; Philippines December 6-7, returning to Washington on December 8. No other city in China except Peking because the President has been there before and because the decision was made that this would be a working visit. President will stop in Hawaii on the way home. Don't know whether or not Mrs. Ford will go. We have every reason to believe that the President will be received with every courtesy and with all appropriate protocol, meeting at the highest levels.

NEW YORK CITY: There has finally been some serious action taken by New York City and New York State to solve their own financial problems. President feels that this apparent action largely is the result of his own firm position against a federal bailout for New York City. Simon has asked Carey to send him the full details of their plan to help NYC solve its own problems. Plan is expected to be here within the next few days. Simon has also asked the participants in the plan to indicate in writing their commitment to carry out the plan. There is, according to what we have seen, a need for money to tide over the seasonal period; however, there is no indication that this must be federal money.

SUPREME COURT: President will discuss with Justice Department and others his nominee for this job. It is one of the most important decisions that any President is called upon to make. There is a certain urgency to have a full court and the President will act as quickly as possible. The President has in mind the extreme importance of this nomination. There is no time schedule that RN can give on when the nominee will be announced. President has not had time to develop a lengthy list of qualifications he is looking for; however, he is looking for the best qualified person for the court.

ENERGY BILL: Frank Zarb has his own notes on the bill and the President wants to read it and study it before reaching his conclusion. He was in to talk to the President this morning and outlined what was in the bill.

PARIS TRIP: Ron will try to have a briefing Saturday night after the first meeting. Will have texts of what is released will be available here in the Press Office as soon as possible. Press notes will be available here at 3:00 PM today. Hope to have the first day's schedule available here this afternoon.

THANKSGIVING DAY: President will spend most of the day working in the White House on Thanksgiving Day on China preparation. President will tape a Thanksgiving message for the American public this afternoon for release at 6:00 PM tomorrow night. Mike Duffy at ABC is the person to contact if you want a copy of the video tape. If you want a copy of the audio tape, contact the radio desk at ABC. Transcript will be out this afternoon embargoed for 6:00 PM tomorrow night.

CHINA: The last shots will be administered tomorrow afternoon at 2:00 in the press office. If you plan to stay in Peking, or if you wish to interview any Chinese officials, please let our office know by 2:00 PM today so that we can cable your requests to Peking. Weather in China -- getting colder 20° and 30 mph winds. Wear warm clothing, especially those participating in stakeouts. It is very dry in China at this time of year. Take lotion of some kind. Don't have any schedule details on Alaska portion of trip. Will have them tomorrow hopefully. Schedule on China trip will be done on a day by day basis. Will be distributed to the press area in the morning. Bob Mead is returning tonight and bring security forms with him which will have to be filled out and turned in to the Chinese upon arrival in Peking. Press Center and headquarters will be at the Hotel Minzu on the 10th floor. There will be 10 LD's at the airport, and 20 LD's at the press center and 10 telex at the press center at the Minzu. You will be issued two identification cards, one which you must carry with you at all times. It is written in Chinese and explains that you are with the press corps and staying at the Minzu Hotel and please help you get back to the hotel -- you are lost. Courtesy to the Chinese is a must. You should let them enter the elevator first and if offered a Chinese cigarette, you should offer them an American one back. They have been very courteous to Eric and the rest of the staff while they have been there. The food is superb!!!! Press planes will refuel at Yakoda, arriving in Peking between 9 and 11 PM Sunday night. President will arrive early to mid afternoon sometime on Monday.
