RON NESSEN BRILFING December 8, 1975

SCHEDULE ITEMS: The President came in about 10:00 a.m., had his usual staff meetings, and will have an Economic Policy Board meeting at 2 p.m. today. Main agenda item for the 2 p.m. meeting will be the Tax Cut bill.

LETTER TO PIKE COMMITTEE: Mr. Buchen's letter to Chairman Pike was made available in the Press Office. In regard to this whole matter, the White House is presently making every effort to comply with the first two subpoenas. Concerning the third subpoena, the President feels that that falls within the area of Executive Privilege, and that this is justified. An offer has been made to supply Congress with summaries of the material in question.

NYC AUTHORIZATION BILL: The legislation will go through the normal process - doubt if the President will sign it today, perhaps within the next couple of days. No decision yet on the Common Situs Picketing bill or the Energy Bill....

TAX CUT BILL: Discussion of this bill is on the agenda of the EPB meeting later this afternoon. The President feels that Congress can pass on this legislation before Christmass recess. He will, however, veto the bill if it is passed without a spending ceiling.





ANGOLA: Still no definition of what the U.S. involvement is in Angola. BG indicated that when we are ready to outline the U.S. involvement, if any, it will be done by the President, and when he does it, it will be clear as to what the reason has been for not announcing the information previously. The President feels he is receiving adequate intelligence information regarding U.S. activities in Angola. We have no exploitive interests in Angola nor do we contemplate any form of U.S. combat intervention there. We are concerned about the extent of outside intervention in Angola as we have stated before. We do not have, nor do we contemplate sending military nor non-military advisers in Angola. No known government advisers in Angola. Secy. Kissinger said we have tried to be helpful and provide some assistance to neighboring friendly countries (referring to Zaire). He declined to go any further.

TAX BILL: President expects and hopes his veto will be sustained on the tax bill if it comes down here without the spending ceiling on it. It is not here yet. He will act on it as soon as it gets here.

GEORGE BUSH/V.P.: President has not ruled anyone out or in with respect to a possible VP candidate.

STEVENS SWEARING-IN: President will attend Stevens swearing in ceremony tomorrow at the Superme Court in the Court Room at 10:00 AM tomorrow He will leave the White House at 9:45 AM and return about 10:"55 AM. Anyone wishing to cover the ceremony, should contact the Court Information Officer, Room 30, Ground Floor, S.C. Passes may be picked up between 8:00 and 9:45 AM tomorrow. Any other details can be obtained from Frank M. Hepler - Marshal of the Court - 393-1640.

PARDON TESTIMONY: In the President's testimony on the Hill, he stated that at no time after he became President, was the subject of a pardon for FPN raised by staff members until the day before the President's press conference on August 28, 1974. The President gave no assurances to Gen. Haig on the pardoning of FPN on August 28th or prior to that day. The President also testified that the first talk about a pardon came up on August 1, in a meeting he had with Gen. Haig at 3:30 PM when Haig mentioned the possibility of a pardon as one of five options involved in the resignation. There was no impassioned plea by General Haig or any other member of the staff to pardon FPN. President and General Haig both said today that they had never seen the Garment memo. Buchen had it when he was preparing questions for the President prior to the press conference, but he returned it to Garment after he had finished it.

ANGOLA: Nothing beyond what was said yesterday.

BUSH-V.P.: As stated in the letter to Senator Stennis, Bush asked the President to indicate that Bush would not be considered as VP. President feels that the post should never be tendered to a six month period.

LA GUARDIA BOMBING: President had a meeting last night with government officials to discuss the bombing at LaGu rdia airport. We will have a transcript of RN's briefing which followed the President's meeting. There are 300 FBI agents who are involved in the case and additional agents will join the investigation as it spreads. FAA has taken some steps to improve security at 500 airports around the country. President expressed shock and interest in the incident and will meet again on Friday with the same group to receive their recommendations.

CONVERSATION WITH THE PRESIDENT: President will meet at 11:30 AM in the OO with a group of 20-22 reporters to respond to a "year-end roundup" of his accomplishments. Those who are not in on this interview will be included in future ones. We will have a transcript available here as soon as possible. "Conversation" will be piped into the briefing room, but cannot be used until interview is completed.

BICENTENNIAL MESSAGE: Around 3:00 PM today the President will videotape a Bicentennial year message. It will be for release at 6:00 PM.

NEW YEAR'S EVE: President and Mrs. Ford wil spend a quiet New Year's Eve at home. Will give out details later on whether or not anyone will join them. Weekend plans are for the WH -- no plan to go to CD.

P.M. RABIN: Will visit the U.S. From January 27 to February 4, in response to an invitation by the President. He will visit other cities in the U.S. No itinerary known at this time. He last visited the U.S. - (Washington) in September 1974 and January 1975.

ST. LOUIS TRIP: Press Plane check-in is 7:30 AM -- Press Plane departure - 8:00 AM AFI departure 9:10 AM from AAFB -- 10:10 AM arrival Lambert Field. He will have remarks to the American Farm Bureau Federation at 11:15 AM in Kiel Auditorium. There are 5,000 expected to be in attendance. Following the speech, he will attend a reception for the Federation. President will depart St. Louis at 1:05 PM. There is time to schedule another event, but nothing has been firmed up as yet.

MISCELLANEOUS: President called Fran Tarkenton at 8:30 PM. He was in Athens, Ga. when the President talked to him, expressing his sorrow at the loss of Fran's father, who died of a heart attack.
