Mathews did bring the President up to date on outlook of legislation to clear up liability problems re swine flu vaccine. (The House Health Subcommittee last evening reported out a bill that would resolve the liability problem. Trying to get action on measure before recess of Congress) Sec. Mathews is keeping manufacturers and insurance companies informed. The earliest determination on cause of illness in Philadelphia will be no earlier than tomorrow afternoon.

The President met with Senator Clifford Case at the Senator's request to discuss the N.J. delegation to the Convention. Meeting lasted 5 to 10 minutes.

Purpose of meeting was to discuss UN business and Scranton's recent trip to Europe. No politics involved.

ANNOUNCE MENTS:

TRAVEL:

The President will go to CD Friday, but we do not have a departure time as yet from the WH. Pool questions should go to Larry. Transportation will be worked out by us. The P will chopper from CD to Phila and return via AFI, there will be the usual press plane. See attached. We don't have any word on an advance as yet, and when asl whether or not the mystery disease will have anything to do with keeping the P out of Phila, RN said that if the CDC comes up with something that would make it inadvisible to go to Phila or if precautions should be made, we will make the necessary arrangements. Also if we do get info from the CDC concerning the disease and its possible effect on the P's trip to Phila, RN will inform the press.

DELEGATES:

We don't have any plans for delegates to come in today or for the rest of the week. Also, concerning John Connolly, we don't have anything on him meeting with the Pres., he is here attending a PFIAB meeting, and will possibly be here tomorrow. OFF THE RECORD: RN said that the Pres did not know that JC was here until RN informed him today.

LEADERSHIP MTG:

RN indicated that among topics discussed were the clean air amendments; the post card voter registration proposals; and brief mention of the swine flu bill. On the voter registration, the Pres opposes it for at least 2 reasons: 1) He feels that the bill would lend itself to possibilities fo fraud; 2) He does feel that this is something Congress would be injecting itself into that is traditionally handled by the states.

SALT TREATY:

Have the Soviets violated the underground treaty? In answer, RN said l) the treaty has not been ratified as yet; 2) the technicians are still going over measurements to determine exactly how much the expolsions were. Both the US and the USSR have made unilateral statements regarding the 150 kilotonnage limit. Since we don't know the size of the 2 USSR we can't say that the Soviet blasts are incompatible with the treaty. RN went on to say that if Congress would ratify the treaty, then all provisions would apply including the 150 kilo ton limit. The President was briefed on the 2 tests.

PFC/VA DELEGATES:

When asked by a VA del when he would announce his running mate, RN said that the Pres indicated that the President will announce his running mate in the traditional manner. When asked if Rog Morton would be leaving the PFC, RN said that he expects him to stay, and that there are no plans for Rog to leave.

VEEP SELECTION:

The Pres believes that "he has established a sound procedure" to get views on his running mate. He thinks that's the "proper" way to proceed. Furthermore, there is a new group that has been sent a letter requesting views on a Veep choice, letters have been sent out to 350 Republican mayors and other officials. The Pres feels that this is a worthwhile method to get wide ranging opinions on his veep choice. In addition, the Pres will welcome anyone's ideas on his choice of a running mate.

George Bush will go to Plains, Georgia, on Thursday, August 12 to brief J. Carter. This is the second of these briefings.

V. P. SELECTION:

PHASE TWO: "Associates" of the President will start this weekend contacting individuals that they have been considered for the V. P. job. These people will be asked, if they are interested, to compile information on a broad range of questions. Included in the report will be the status of their health, a financial balance sheet, personal; and information on their taxes from '66 through '75. In addition they will be asked to compile information which would normally be required of any individual who is being considered for a high level job by the President. The individual will be asked to commit himself to making public three items: Health Statement, Financial Statement, and Tax Information. They also will be asked to agree to let the President's associates contact references who would be expected to know about their background etc. No names in any case were given out by RN.

LUNCH LID UNTIL 2:30 p.m.

The President and Mrs. Ford will depart for Camp David possibly as early as 4 or 4:30 this afternoon. Those who will be covering up there for the Wires should plan to leave at least by 3, I would advise. These times could change, but we will let you know.

The President will return to Washington--possibly Saturday night, but more likely Sunday morning. There is a good possibility he will attend church on Sunday.

(FYI: Mrs. Ford will go on Friday afternoon; Susan will go by car on Saturday morning; Jack is uncertain; and Mike and Gayle will only be in town Sunday and will not go to Camp David.)

The President will go to Philadelphia on Air Force One, departing the South Grounds at 2:35 p.m. and leaving Andrews at about 3 p.m.
