I ask the Congress to consider amendments and supplementals to the request for appropriations transmitted in the budget for the fiscal year 1975 in the amount of \$4,629,824,000 for the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare. These funds were proposed for later transmittal and are provided for within the 1975 budget totals.

The details of this proposal are set forth in the enclosed letter from the Director of the Office of Management and Budget whose comments and observations I concur.

Sir:

I have the honor to submit for your consideration amendments and supplementals to the request for appropriations transmitted in the budget for fiscal year 1975, involving \$4,629,824,000 for the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare.

The budget included these amounts, proposed for later transmittal, to fund education legislation then under consideration by the Congress and also to place these programs on a forward funded basis.

The proposed budget amendments and supplementals would provide for support of education programs included in the recently enacted Education Amendments of 1974 (P.L. 93-380). This legislation was not acted upon by the Congress in time to permit a 1974 supplemental appropriation to begin the forward funding mechanism in FY 1974. Therefore, this request proposes to make the forward funding supplemental funds available in school year 1975-76 from fiscal 1975 funds.

Details of these proposed amendments and supplementals are contained in the enclosure to this letter.

I have carefully reviewed the proposals for appropriations contained in this document and am satisfied that these requests are necessary at this time. I recommend, therefore, that these proposals be transmitted to the Congress.

Occupational, Vocational, and Adult Education

For an additional amount for "Occupational, vocational, and adult education," \$126,638,000: Provided, That of this amount \$63,319,000 shall become available for obligation on July 1, 1975 and shall remain available through June 30, 1976.

These amounts would be used to fund the reauthorized Adult Education Act, which is contained within the Education Amendments of 1974, P.L. 93-380. The funds will not be used to support activities under section 309A.

Library Resources

For an additional amount for "Library resources" \$90,250,000.

These amounts would be used to support school libraries under Title II of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, which is contained in the Education Amendments of 1974, P.L. 93-380.

That, notwithstanding clause (a) (i) of the second paragraph (2) of section 305 (a) of P.L. 93-380, none of the funds contained herein shall be available to pay any local educational agency in excess of 90 per centum of the amounts to which such agency would otherwise be entitled pursuant to section 3(a) of said title I if the number of children in average daily attendance in schools of that agency eligible under said section 3(a) is less than 25 per centum of the total number of children in such schools: Provided further, That, with the exception of up to \$1,000,000 for repairs for facilities constructed under section 10, none of the funds contained herein for providing school facilities shall be available to pay for any other section of the Act of September 23, 1950, until payment has been made of 100 per centum of the amounts payable under section 5 and subsections 14(a) and 14(b): Provided further, That of the funds provided herein for carrying out the Act of September 23, 1950, no more than 47.5 per centum may be used to
