THE WHITE HOUSE

The President today announced his intention to nominate Henry Bramwell, of Brooklyn, New York, to be United States District Judge for the Eastern District of New York. He succeeds John R. Bartels who retired.

Mr. Bramwell was appointed to the Civil Court of the City of New York and in 1966 and in 1969 was elected to a ten year term. From 1961 to 1962 he was Associate Chief Enforcement Attorney and later became Associate Attorney of the New York State Temporary Housing Rent Commission, serving until 1964. In 1953 he became Assistant U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of New York. From 1958 to 1963 he practiced law in Brooklyn, New York.

Mr. Bramwell was born on September 3, 1919 in Brooklyn, New York and received his B.A. degree from Brooklyn College in 1941. He received his LL.B. degree from Brooklyn Law School in 1948. He also did additional work at the New York University Graduate School of Law.

Mr. Bramwell is married and resides in Brooklyn, New York.
