NOTICE TO THE PRESS

The President today announced the appointment of Walter Tice, of Yonkers, New York, to be a Member of the National Advisory Council on Education for the remainder of a term expiring April 26, 1976. He succeeds Joseph S. Radom who resigned effective November 16, 1974.

He is President of the Yonkers Federation of Teachers and Vice President of the American Federation of Teachers.

The Council, consisting of 15 members appointed by the President, was established by P.L. 90-35 of June 29, 1967 to review the operations of the Federal programs for the training and development of educational personnel, and evaluating their effectiveness in meeting needs for additional educational personnel. The Council makes an annual report to the President and the Congress on its findings and recommendations.

Members serve terms not exceeding three years.
