## THE WHITE HOUSE

The President today announced his intention to nominate Philip H. Modlin, of Alexandria, Virginia, to be a member of the Board of Parole for a term expiring September 30, 1977. He will succeed William T. Woodard, Jr., who resigned effective December 27, 1974.

Since 1970, Mr. Modlin has been Director of the Executive Office for United States Attorneys, Department of Justice. From 1968 to 1969, he was Assistant to the Deputy Attorney General for Lawyer Careers, after serving with the Department of Justice from 1958 to 1967 as Deputy Director, Executive Office for United States Attorneys. He later returned as Deputy Director in 1969, serving until 1970. From 1956 to 1958, Mr. Modlin served successively in private industry as Assistant to the Director of Labor Relations for the Reynolds Metals Company of Richmond, Virginia, and as Director of Industrial Relations of the Thiebolt Aircraft Division of the Vitro Corporation of America of Martinsburg, West Virginia.

Mr. Modlin was born on October 9, 1926, in Jamestown, North Carolina. He received his A. B. degree from High Point College in 1947 and his J. D. degree from the University of North Carolina in 1950. He also has done graduate work at George Washington University. He is a member of the North Carolina and the District of Columbia Bar. He was with the Department of Labor from 1952 to 1953 as an attorney and later became Supervisor of Employee Relations for Government Services, Inc.

Mr. Modlin is married to the former Rosalind Robinson, and they have three children. They reside in Alexandria, Virginia.
