The President today announced his intention to nominate John F. Lehman, Jr., of Glenside, Pennsylvania, to be Deputy Director of the United States Arms Control and Disarmament Agency. He will succeed J. Owen Zurhellen, Jr. who resigned effective January 13, 1975.

Dr. Lehman is currently a Member of the United States Delegation to the Mutual and Balanced Force Reduction Talks. From January of 1974 to June of 1974, he was a Visiting Fellow, School for Advanced International Studies, John Hopkins University. In 1969 he joined the National Security Council staff, serving until 1974. From 1967 to 1969 he was a staff member of the Foreign Policy Research Institute in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Dr. Lehman was born on September 14, 1942 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He received his B.S. degree from St. Joseph's College of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in 1964. He was awarded a B.A. and M.A. degree from Cambridge University in England in 1967. In 1974 he received his M.A. and his Ph.D. from the University of Pennsylvania. He has been an Officer in the United States Naval Reserve since 1967.

Dr. Lehman resides in Glenside, Pennsylvania.
