THE WHITE HOUSE

The President today announced his intention to nominate Victor V. Veysey, of Brawley, California, to be Assistant Secretary of the Army (Civil Works). Mr. Veysey served as a United States Congressman, representing the 43rd District of California from 1970 to 1974.

From 1963 to 1970, Mr. Veysey served as Assemblyman for the California State Legislature. From 1949 to 1965 he was the manager of a family ranching operation in Imperial Valley, California. In 1938 he joined the California Institute of Technology as an Instructor and later became an Assistant Professor, serving until 1948. From 1940 to 1941 he was an Instructor in Industrial Management, at Stanford University Graduate School of Business Administration.

Mr. Veysey was born on April 14, 1915, in Los Angeles, California. He received his B.S. degree from the California Institute of Technology in 1936 and his M.B.A. degree in 1938 from Harvard University.

Mr. Veysey is married to the former Janet Donaldson and they have four children. They reside in Falls Church, Virginia.
