NOTICE TO THE PRESS

The President today announced his intention to nominate James H. Henson, of Smyrna, Georgia to be United States Marshal for the Northern District of Georgia for a term of four years. He will succeed Bill C. Murray who has resigned.

Mr. Henson served as Deputy United States Marshal for the Northern District of Georgia from 1955 to 1974. In 1974 he was Court appointed as United States Marshal.

The President today announced his intention to nominate H. Brooks Phillips, of Oxford, Mississippi, to be United States Marshal for the Northern District of Mississippi for a term of four years. This is a reappointment.

Mr. Phillips has served as a United States Marshal since 1971.

The President today announced his intention to nominate Emmett G. Wyche, of Bossier City, Louisiana, to be United States Marshal for the Western District of Louisiana for a term of four years. He will succeed Joseph W. Keene who is deceased.

Mr. Wyche served as a Deputy United States Marshal for the Western District of Louisiana from 1948 to 1961 when he was appointed Chief Deputy United States Marshal. In December 1974 he was Court appointed as United States Marshal.

The President is designating William S. Mailliard, of San Francisco, California, to serve concurrently as the Representative of the United States on the Inter-American Economic and Social Council of the Organization of American States and as the Representative of the United States on the Inter-American Council for Education, Science and Culture of the Organization of American States.

Mr. Mailliard is currently the Permanent Representative to the Organization of American States, with the rank of Ambassador.

Mr. Mailliard was a member of the United States House of Representatives from 1952 to 1973.
