Arrival of President Ford and First Head to Head Meeting With President Sadat

The President and Henry Kissinger arrived in the Presidential limousine at 4:55 p.m. for the Head to Head meeting. The President shook hands with someone who appeared to be some sort of household difficial of the Chancellor's Residence. Then the President and his party walked to three long flights of red carpeted stairs, through a 150 foot long hallway with 75 foot ceilings and magnificent freezees, to the cavernous room, where the receiling took plate. The official party sat on red procade soids at one end of the hoge room. Sadat was on the President's left; on Saund's left were Egyptian Vice President Achammad Hushi Midarak and Foreign Minister ismail Fahmy. Kissinger sat on the President's right and Under Secretary of State Joseph Sisco and on Kissinger's right. There was a pipe, presumably the President's on the table in front of Eurol and S. dat.

The pool could not hear any of the discussion, although the President was animated, generating with his hands and doing most of the tacking. Saidt did most of the unbling and smiling.
