(Remove brackets from the above heading and add the following paragraph thereunder:)

For comprehensive planning grants as authorized by Section 701 of the Housing Act of 1954, as amended (40 U.S.C. 461), \$50,000,000, to remain available until expended.

The proposed budget amendment would provide for grants to States, areawide agencies, and local governments for comprehensive planning and management activities. The original Administration proposal for fiscal year 1976

involved the use of \$50,000,000 deferred from the fiscal year 1975 appropriation. The Senate overrode that deferral on March 13, 1975, making use of the deferred funds mandatory in fiscal year 1975. The budget amendment is necessary to provide the program level for Comprehensive Planning Grants originally proposed for fiscal year 1976.

I have carefully reviewed the proposal for appropriations contained in this document and am satisfied that this request is necessary at this time. I recommend, therefore, that this proposal be transmitted to the Congress.
