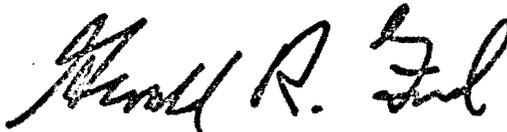
The Speaker of the

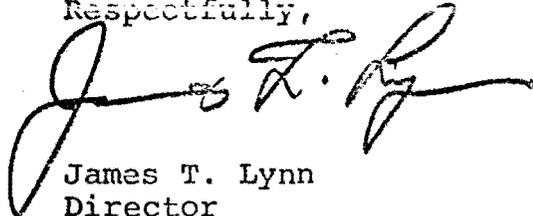
