## The President's Schedule

At 7:00 a.m. today the President held a breakfast meeting with Congressman John J. Rhodes to discuss a proposed House Republican legislative program. The meeting was requested by Congressman Rhodes.

At 8:00 this morning the President met with the Republican Congressional Leadership to consult with them on energy legislation and Turkish aid legislation. Tomorrow, both the House and Senate will consider resolutions disapproving the President's phased oil decontrol plan; the Senate has passed S. 1849, a six-month extension of the allocation control bill, and the House is to vote on it this week; both the House and Senate have passed H.R. 4035, a decontrol bill opposed by the Administration; the House is considering the Dingell energy bill which rolls back prices. This week the House will vote on the Morgan/Broomfield bill partially lifting the Turkish arms aid embargo.

At 12:45 this afternoon the President will receive the first collection of the prayer proclamations of America beginning in 1775, when the first National Day of Prayer was proclaimed by the Second Continental Congress. The collection includes 181 proclamations of Congresses and Presidents. The President has proclaimed July 24, 1975, as National Day of Prayer, 1975. Those making the presentation will be: The Right Reverend John M. Allin, Presiding Bishop, Episcopal Church; The Reverend Dr. Lawrence W. Bottoms, Moderator of the General Assembly, Presbyterian Church in the U.S.; Rabbi Joseph Looksteen, President, Synagogue Council of America; Dr. Muhamad Abdul Raul, Director, The Islamic Center; Father Michael J. Sheehan, Assistant General Secretary, National Conference of Catholic Bishops; Peter P. Stewart, President, Thanksgiving Square Foundation; Dr. Kenneth L. Teegarden, General Minister and President, Christian Church (Disciples of Christ); and The Reverend Robert Nelson West, President, Unitarian Universalist Association. (PHOTO)
